From Father Schmeckel:

October 22 is usually the Memorial of **Pope Saint John Paul II** – though the 29th Sunday of Ordinary Time takes precedence this year. He was the Pope from 1978 until his death in 2005. Given his long reign, he is one of the first popes that many people today remember. There is a whole generation of younger priests, consecrated virgins, and religious sisters who attribute their vocation to some encounter they had with him or his teachings. Personally, this has not been my experience, however, since I went to the seminary and became a priest, I find that Saint John Paul II keeps popping up in my life. Almost every year when I make my silent retreat, I read a portion of a book



by or about him and it makes a significant impact on my prayers during the week. Perhaps you too have a surprising saint who has chosen you – who catches your imagination and attention even though you may not know why. These saints can become friends for us and help us to live a good Christian life.

If you're interested in the life of Saint John Paul II, there is a great film available on **FORMED.org** that features stars like Cary Elwes and Jon Voight. This film and many other great films, videos, and educational resources are available for free for Blessed Trinity and Saint John Parishioners by visiting FORMED.org and creating a free account. This gives you access to an enormous number of resources that can help you continue to learn and grow in your faith.

For the next few weeks, I will continue to highlight a couple of the areas in each of our parishes where we are in need of new recruits.

At Saint John's, we're thinking about Christmas already even though it's still a few months off. For our Nativity scene this Christmas, we are looking at a new arrangement of our beautiful figures. This might involve building a stable or a background for them. If you have some creative ideas or woodworking skill, this could be a way for you or your family, or a group of individuals or families, to help make a visual impact on how we pray and ponder the mystery of the Christmas Season. Coming Soon: Halloween and All Saints Day - Holiday and Holyday:

Children love Holidays, and many adults do too. Holidays, such as Halloween, remind us how special life is. Halloween is both rich in history and in meaning, and much of it is religious. - 2. Research a favorite Saint and dress up or help children dress as a Saint this year. There are many websites that provide numerous suggestions.



Dear Padre,

Is it a sin to break the law? It is illegal to use fireworks in my city, but every year I do it anyway. Should I mention this in confession?

Strictly speaking, to break a government law does not automatically constitute the definition of sin, so it needn't be mentioned in the sacrament of penance. By definition, sin damages (or, with grave sin, destroys) communion with God and the Church (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 1472). Some actions may not be objectively destructive to our relationship with God and Church—and therefore are not sinful—but they



may affect others. Church members are part of society, which depends on its citizens to abide by the laws. Saint Paul encouraged everyone to obey the authorities, for all authority that exists is established by God (see Romans 13:1–7).

Not all sins are equally offensive to God; similarly, not all civil laws are equal in their gravity. To knowingly travel a few miles over the posted speed limit isn't the same as intentionally starting a fire in a posted area of a forest. The danger is in thinking one's actions are without consequence. Sensible civil laws are designed to ensure the safety and well-being of citizens, and many municipalities outlaw fireworks because of the hazards they pose.

When any civil law is broken for mere self-indulgence or when breaking the law places others at risk, the act has the potential of constituting the definition of sin. In that case, it would rightfully warrant sacramental reconciliation.
