

From Father Schmeckel:

Merry Christmas! Remember that the Christmas season continues through the Baptism of the Lord, which is on Monday, January 8 this year.

During this joyous season, I want to say "thank you" to all who have helped us to celebrate Christmas, the Birth of Jesus, our Savior with such great joy and exuberance. Special thanks to our staff and volunteers who helped with music, worship aids, cleaning, decorating, reading, serving, and many, many other things during this Christmas Season and who continue to do this throughout the year.



As the calendar year winds down, I want to point out a few practical things that have been done in each of our parishes and a few things to look forward to in the year ahead.

At Saint John Evangelist Parish:

During this past semester we began working on technology upgrades in our classrooms to improve internet connectivity, provide projectors, and eventually have computers available in each room. While there are several things that remain to be completely finished, this will be a great use of donations through the "Faith in our Future Campaign" that will provide Catechists with more materials and resources to help our children and young people learn and grow, and will help adults deepen their faith.

As you may have noticed, our crèche (or nativity scene) at St. John's is a little different this year. Max Schefsky, a student from Blessed Trinity, built the stable and its stand as part of his Eagle Scout project. This wonderful addition has already helped to lift our devotion to the Infant Jesus in the manger. I hope it has also helped you to pray and meditate on the great mysteries of Christmas. Thank you for your hard work, Max!

In this new year, there will also be many other projects around our campus that may need some work. We will likely need to give some attention to the sound system in the church. Everything we have now works, but there are a few signs of its age and normal wear-and-tear. A portion of our "Love One Another Campaign" funds were designated for this purpose and will help us to make those necessary upgrades and improvements.

At Blessed Trinity Parish:

At the Catholic Life Center at Blessed Trinity Parish a handicapped-accessible bathroom has been under construction for the past two months. This project has now been completed along with some other things which surfaced along the way. There is also new carpeting and fresh paint, and some leakage issues were taken care of. Mike Matoska, Tim Woodworth, Mike White, Gene Specht, Paul Klauck, and several others have put in many, many hours over these past few months to make the completion of all of this work possible. These great improvements and more accessible facilities will enable us to serve and reach more people.

This Spring, the church elevator project, that was recently approved by the Archdiocese, will begin. The exact start date is still to be determined. There will be a few adjustments to weekday schedules to accommodate construction, and we will communicate them as they are known to us. This is also one of the projects that will be paid for with funds from the "Love One Another Campaign

Soon we will also have to start considering carpet replacement options In the Sanctuary to elevate our worship at Mass. This is not an immediate project, but something we should keep in mind.

Finally, Monday, January 1, 2024 is the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God. It is not a holy day of obligation this year, but Mass will be offered at 9:00 AM at Saint John Evangelist Parish.

Happy New Year - January 2024:

The start of a new year almost always provides us with an opportunity to begin again and to set goals or make plans to do something that might really make a difference. Rather than thinking of ways to improve or to eliminate a bad habit as in past years, you may want to consider a new question: What is God calling me, or our family, to do in 2024?



Here's something you might want to try: During the next few days choose a Saint that you, and/or your family, can learn more about and try to imitate him/her during 2024. Select a Saint that you feel would be a good fit. For example: You or your family might choose St. John the Evangelist, the patron Saint of our parish, or St. Anthony, because you are constantly misplacing things, or St. (Mother) Teresa of Calcutta, who cared for the poor and others in need, because you want to do more of this in the new year.

After you have selected your patron Saint for 2024, there are many things you can do. Here are a few suggestions:

- Find and put a statue or a picture of that Saint in your home.
- Find a book, an article, or a video about your Saint. If you have children, find a book they can read or listen to and give it to them on a special occasion.
- Learn something new about your Saint each month.
- Celebrate your Saint's feast day and have some special food or dessert that reminds you of your chosen Saint.
- Do a quick google search to see if your Saint has a prayer you can say and post it somewhere in your home. Include this prayer in your morning or bedtime prayer routine for the year.
- Throughout the year you or other family members can make crafts and do activities relating to your Saint and his or her work with others. Check out websites with ideas for Catholic children.

Adopting a Saint for the year may also help you and/or your family have more Saints to feel "close" to. The number can grow each year. This Saint can become a spiritual inspiration and give you or your family a reason to celebrate a new Saint feast day each year and learn about the traditions that go along with the Saint.

The New Year is just beginning. 

Dear Padre,

How much should we support our adult children? We have a niece and a daughter who are both healthy, capable, and in their twenties. We have set boundaries and continue to give to them but they just can't seem to get their act together. Would it be unchristian to cut them off?

The Catechism of the Catholic Church describes in detail the duties of family members toward each other (CCC 2214-33). Parents are responsible to ensure that their children grow up in faith and to



meet their basic needs. Children should show respect toward their parents and, as they grow older, assist them as needed. As children become adults, they should take on responsibility for themselves and parents are not to pressure them into choices of a profession or a spouse, while at the same time, "giving their children judicious advice...." (CCC 2230). At some point, children need to become responsible adults, which brings us to your point.

You seem to have done what is required as parents. At the same time, you would not want to abandon young adults if physical, mental, or emotional factors prevent them from assuming the responsibility of adulthood. If they are healthy, capable young people they should be able to progress in life without your financial assistance. To help them toward this goal, you may want to set very specific limits, perhaps with the help of a counselor, and then consistently follow those limits.
