

We will burn them for ashes for Ash Wednesday.

Our Parish Catechists - Religious Educators of our Children

Catechists work hard. They share their faith and knowledge, and they give up personal time to plan lessons, be at class, and pray for their students. They echo the faith to our children, young people, and adults. These women and men generously give of their time and their talent to instruct their students in the faith. Teaching the faith is to hand on the truths of what we believe according to the age level of the student so that it is understood and touches the life of the one who has received it. A Catechist is a witness to that faith.

The ministry of a Catechist requires study, patience, prayer, preparation, witness and a serious commitment of time and talent. The work of each Catechist is to assist Parents to help their children:

- come to know our triune God,
- encounter Jesus,
- \dot{i} understand the Scripture stories and the Bible itself,
- appreciate the rich history and traditions of our Catholic Faith,

While this is difficult achieve, it is vitally important. Each Catechist faithfully instructs and attempts to form and inspire his or her students according to the teachings of the Catholic Church. It is a sacred ministry and essential for the life and the future of our Church.

Recognizing the need for our Catechists and all who are involved in the Religious Education of children and youth to become more deeply rooted in a relationship with God and in the vocation of teaching and living the Gospel, a Countywide Retreat was planned by the Directors of Religious Education in Sheboygan County and three Notre Dame University Student Apprentices serving in several of the local parishes. Catechists from the ten parishes in the County and others were invited to step away from the busyness of their lives and into a morning filled with prayer, listening, learning, building community, and renewing the Spirit.

This week in the 7-12 grade Religious Education at St. John Evangelist, we had our class on Wednesday, February 2 at Blessed Trinity so we could attend a "mini retreat" given by NET ministries out of Minnesota. It was a good collaboration with our fellow Catholics in Sheboygan Falls and a great opportunity for all of our students to hear and witness other young people give their time and love of Jesus and His church to all of us! Speaking of retreats, on Saturday, January 29 a group



of St. John Evangelist catechists met for a morning retreat at St. John the Baptist in Plymouth with other catechists from around Sheboygan County. We began with Mass and had a morning of fellowship and active learning that included tips and best practices of how to bring Christ into our classrooms! Thanks to ALL of our dedicated volunteers who give their time and talents to inspire and impart our faith to our Religious Education students! Lots of great stuff happening here at St. John Evangelist, so thanks and come, Holy Spirit!! Another event that happened today after the 9:00 am Mass is our church social, followed by a church tour. In Catholic theology, there are three properties of God, known as "transcendentals", Latin meaning "to exceed." These arose from medieval scholasticism and are commonly considered to be truth, goodness and beauty. As Catholics, we are blessed because for us, truth is a somebody, not a something....Jesus! (John 14:6, where Jesus says, "I am the way, the truth and the life.") St. Paul in 2Cor9:8 reminds us that "God is good all the time. All the time, God is good." There are Bible verses about the beauty of God, but many saints, like St. Thomas Aquinas, St. John Paul II and St. Francis of Assisi assert that God is beauty itself, so another name for God IS beauty!! Of course, people may disagree on what is true or what is good, but most everyone can always agree on beauty! Look at a gorgeous sunset or snow-capped mountains. Smell a colorful bouquet of magnificent flowers. Hold a sweet, little baby and see it smile and you will encounter beauty/God! How blessed we are to have such a "beauty-full" church to worship in here at St. John Evangelist! Indeed, sacred architecture and the religious objects in them help us glorify God and lift our hearts and minds to Him, who is true and good and beautiful!! 

Dear Padre,

I heard some people talking about the coming of the Antichrist. Who or what is this Antichrist?

S ome Christian sects believe there will come a point when the faithful of their church will be taken off the earth and whisked into heaven. This is usually referred to as "the rapture." After this event, they believe the Antichrist will come. This Antichrist is an individual man who will incarnate in himself the power of Satan. He will deceive even the holiest person and will

rule the entire world. It is believed that Jesus will then return and defeat this Antichrist in the ultimate battle between good and evil. The appearance of the Antichrist supposedly coincides with the end of time.

Most of the material that would support this scenario is found in the thirteenth chapter of the Book of Revelation. Here the devil tries to stop Christ's victory and to convince people that Christ is not the master. This chapter of Revelation deals with the conflict in the Roman Empire between the emperor Nero and the faithful Christians. Nero, the evil one, is assigned the number 666 so Christians could refer to him without openly attacking him. This section of the book was written to give hope to persecuted Christians.



Instead of worrying about the end of time, an Antichrist, a final battle, and "evil" numbers, Catholics are encouraged to believe that Christ has already conquered sin, death, and Satan. God's reign is already here in our midst (see Luke 17:20–21). Our task is to prepare for our own moment of dying and meeting the Lord. We leave the rest to God's providence!
