

# Eent 2022: Gathering for Mass and Deepening our Prayer Lives

On Ash Wednesday, March 2, families, parishioners, and others gathered with Religious Education students after classes for Mass and to mark the beginning of the Church's observance of the Lenten season—six weeks that are set apart for the purpose of drawing closer to God and seeking God with greater intensity.

Throughout the season of Lent, we are called to deepen our prayer life. For some this means



attending Daily or Sunday Mass and setting aside time each day to share hopes, joys, fears, and frustrations with God. Praying first thing in the morning, while the house is still quiet, or talking to God while driving to work are simple ways to integrate prayer into everyday life as are visits to Church (St John's is open in the mornings. Surrounding parishes have Adoration at other times! during the week.) or attending Lenten presentations. Here are some additional ways to pray!

Personal reflective Prayer - Lent is a time of spiritual renewal. One easy step that can be taken to increase daily prayer opportunities is to use the many free online resources to jump-start or reinvigorate prayer life. Many Catholic prayer sites can be found online. Catholic books are plentiful as are free Lenten guides.

The Stations of the Cross - One of the most common traditions of Lent is to pray the Stations of the Cross. This prayer is the story of the passion and death of Christ in preparation for Good Friday observance and the Easter celebration. Stations of the Cross-prayer services are held here at St. John's at 5:00 PM on Fridays and at other times at nearby parishes, or try one of the many available online resources.

Meditate on Holy Scripture - Perhaps the oldest method of scriptural prayer known to Christians is "holy reading." This method of prayer is characterized by the slow reading and consideration of a text from the Bible, with repetition and meditation on key words or phrases. This type of prayer is rooted in the belief that the Word of God speaks in the human heart.

Reflect more deeply on the Prayers at Mass - When you attend or watch the Mass during Lent, be conscious of and meditate on the words you and the priest celebrant pray. For example, the Eucharistic Prayer, after the Consecration, has very special meaning if you listen carefully.

**Pray with children or as a family** - Being a parent, grandparent, godparent, or teacher is a holy ministry and a sacred promise. Share your faith with children by letting them see and hear you pray, and by praying together, and don't forget about family mealtime prayers.

Start a practice of daily prayer that will last after Lent - Simply praying the entire Rosary, or just one decade or more, each day may bring you to new places in your relationship with God. Perhaps the best prayer advice is to use Lent as a time to instill prayer habits that will last long after Lent has ended, and don't try to do all of the above. Choose one or two of these prayer methods to concentrate on, in order to more fully experience the pilgrim journey toward Easter that is Lent 2022

Today on this second Sunday of Lent, the entire, worldwide Catholic church has the Gospel reading on Jesus' transfiguration on Mt. Tabor. Here Jesus is with Peter, James and John and once again, as at his baptism, he hears the voice of his Father calling him his "beloved Son." Through our baptism, we are also called beloved sons and daughters of God! Let this profound



awareness of God's love and care for us continue to comfort, empower and guide us not just through these days of Lent, but through our entire lives! Some people may love you because of you. Not God. He loves you because he made you and you are his! The Transfiguration happens right after Jesus tells his disciples of his approaching passion and death. He reveals his glory and teaches them through the Law (Moses) and the Prophets (Elijah), as a way to share with them his divine mercy. We are blessed at St. John Evangelist Parish to have a beautiful stained-glass window of this encounter on the west wall of our church. May I suggest that you take the time to truly look at this window and "reflect" on all that is contained in the beauty of this artistic creation as you ponder the unconditional love and mercy that God has for each and every one of us! A daily devotional that I have suggests this "On Mt. Tabor, Peter, James and John got a rare glimpse of Jesus in all of his glory. Today, let him show you his glory. As the priest lifts up the Host on the altar, imagine Jesus as he was at the Transfiguration...his face radiant and his clothes dazzling white. Then kneel down in awe and wonder and worship him and give him thanks." See you at Mass.



Servants of the Good Help Mission – Peru, a 501c3 non-profit organization, reaches out in many ways to serve the needs of adults and children in a third world country – Peru.

- In today's gospel, (Luke 9:28b-36), Jesus went up to the mountain to pray. While he was praying his face changed in appearance and his clothing became dazzling white. Like Peter and his companions, we would have been sleeping since we too would probably be tired from climbing the mountain. Of course, Peter wanted to build three tents, one for Jesus, one for Moses and one for Elijah, but a voice came from the cloud saying, "This is my chosen Son, listen to him." Jesus had no need for a tent, but he had a need for his message to be preached.
- In a similar way, Taylor and Katie Schmidt, along with their seven children, are doing what Jesus told Peter, John, and James to do: "Go out and spread my message." They and their children have become missionaries founders of the Servants of the Good Help Mission in Peru. As their mission unfolds, a major need is having money to buy food for the approximately two hundred children who can attend school. The cost is about \$5 per week to feed a student. Their efforts to provide these meals as well as clean water aid children in their learning process.
- All donations received will go to help feed students who can attend school at the Servants of the Good Help Mission in Peru.



# Dear Padre,

# What is the rationale for believing in God?

While Scripture tells us in story form how God created heaven, earth, and humanity, science tells how he has really done so: from a Big Bang of unharnessed energy; to the formation of Earth and the universe; to the evolution of life; and finally, to us! Creation's unfolding is like a magnificent symphony formed from nothing by a powerful, omniscient composer. This "musical score" of evolution rises and falls, inexorably leading to its culmination—intelligent beings who can ponder the beauty and awe of God's creation.

The odds are totally against an accumulation of "lucky breaks" that make creation possible: our Earth being in a narrow habitable zone, neither too near nor too far from the sun; the appearance of oxygenating plants, allowing us to breathe; a dinosaur-destroying asteroid collision permitting mammals—and eventually us—to evolve. How could all of that be accidental?

Indeed, multitudes have dedicated their lives to God's existence. For more than two millennia, our Church has taught about a loving God in the person of Jesus Christ. Not only do we learn Jesus' teachings regarding God's compassion, forgiveness, and the promises of eternal life, but we see that compassion and forgiveness at work in today's ministry.

A loving relationship with anyone is impossible without trust and faith. So it is with God. We must entrust ourselves to him, opening ourselves to knowing and loving him. For this reason, belief in God is always a grace, a gift freely given from God, which we ask for ourselves.
