

### **RELIGIOUS EDUCATION UPDATE GRADES 7 - 12:**

Happy Easter from all of us at 7-12 grade Religious Education!! Today we pray and praise with thanks and great JOY, "Christ is Risen!" After 40 days of Lent, we sing again "Alleluia." This Greek word actually is derived from the Hebrew "Hallelujah" which literally means "praise God." Why all of the exuberance?



Because the resurrection of Jesus changes EVERYTHING! If Jesus only lived on in spirit, he would be one of a thousand dead heroes. But He lives on in flesh and bones and so His resurrection from the dead defeated death, sin and the devil. What He did with his own grave, He promises to do with ours....empty it! This is precisely why we gather every Sunday for Mass and to celebrate the Eucharist, because every Sunday is a mini-Easter. Our risen Lord is truly present at every Mass and the Eucharist is truly "the body, blood, soul and divinity of Christ." How can we not desire to come to Mass? Just like Mary Magdalene, let's go and look for the Lord and when we find Him (and we will), then we too, will go in haste to tell others this "good news." So seek the Lord today and tomorrow and for your whole life, then your Easter joy will have eternal, unending "hallelujahs!' See you at Mass.


The Holy Saturday Vigil begins with the Spirit of God sweeping across the waters. Redemption has begun – but the discordant drama plays out in our everyday lives. The drama is not yet fulfilled – we do not have to look too far for the Ukraine's and other wartorn segments of God's creation. The tomb is truly empty, the light has broken in ... yet the 'in-between' reality of our lives can be quite dismal. In our emptiness, we still search for that crucified Body – yet we believe that the JESUS has died and returned to His heavenly Father. 'HE IS STILL WITH US.' Being human, we will need reminders throughout the year that 'the Stone has been removed from the Tomb, and we do not know where they have put Him.'


# Dear Padre,

# The Church says unless you're baptized, you will not enter heaven. So how was the unbaptized good thief able to enter paradise?

esus was crucified with two thieves. One taunted Jesus, "Are you not the Messiah? Save yourself and us." The other, rebuking him, said Jesus had done nothing criminal adding, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." Jesus replied to him, saying, "Today you will be with me in Paradise" (Luke 23:39–40, 42–43).

When the good thief rebuked the other, how did he know Jesus had done nothing wrong or that Jesus was going to his kingdom when he died? Scripture provides no background on the good thief to suggest he was baptized, but he's evidently familiar with Jesus' reputation before the crucifixion.

Regardless, even to his dying breath, Jesus desired for all a conversion experience with our compassionate God. God desires salvation for everyone. However, "God has bound salvation to the sacrament of baptism, but he himself is not bound by his sacraments" (*Catechism of the Catholic Church*, 1257). So while the typical way of salvation is through baptism, our merciful God can also give



baptismal grace without the sacrament being conferred! For example, when unbaptized infants die, we have "hope that God will save [them] when we have not been able to do for them what we would have wished to do, namely, to baptize them" (2007 Vatican Commission, "The Hope of Salvation for Infants Who Die Without Being Baptized," 103).
