Caring for Children- Providing a Safe Environment

Every child deserves to grow up in a safe, stable, and nurturing environment, and this Safe Environment Week (April 25-30, 2022) is an opportunity to consider the role we can all play in caring for children. Here are some ways parents, grandparents and all adults can help children feel safe and secure as they live, learn, play, and grow.



- Take turns talking and listening. It can be interesting and sometimes fun to know what everyone is thinking.
- Spend time together. You don't always have to do things that cost money. Go for walks. Read together. Cook together. Visit parks, nature centers, libraries, museums, churches, or socialize with friends outdoors.
- Show respect even when you disagree. There is a right way and a wrong way to settle a fight.
 Teach children that hitting each other and using hurtful words is always wrong.
- Instead of dreading chores make a game of it. See who can finish first or whose room is cleanest.
- Play together. This doesn't have to mean a video or board game. You can make a game out
 of anything. How about playing I Spy, Tic Tac Toe, or telling stories or jokes.
- Learn to apologize and forgive. When someone says they are sorry believe them. Their actions will show if they are.
- Teach children to check in with parents/adults and remind them never talk to strangers and never to tell a stranger that they are home alone.
- If children/teens go online teach them to keep themselves and others safe.
- All children need to feel loved and secure. Make sure the children in your life know you love them, even when they do something wrong.
- Praise their achievements, talents, and most importantly their hard work.

Finally, continue to pray with and for them and let them know that God is always there to care for them and to help.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION UPDATE GRADES 7 - 12:

Today is our second Sunday of Easter, also known as Divine Mercy Sunday! This special feast was given to us by St. Pope John Paul II in the year 2000 and concludes the Octave or 8 Days of Easter (though the season of Easter lasts for a total of 50 days until the feast of Pentecost)! It is based on encounters with Jesus by



St. Faustina Kowalska, in the 1930's, prior to WWII and recorded in her Diary. Jesus said to St. Faustina "humanity will never find peace until it turns with trust to Divine Mercy." This is the Easter gift that the Church receives from the risen Christ and offers to each of us! We see the mercy of Jesus in our Gospel today where Jesus comes again so that Thomas the Apostle can doubt no longer, but believe! And again for us, He says "blessed are those who have not seen and have believed!" This is what we profess with our faith in action, as we strive to live and love authentically, being IN the world, but not OF the world. We concluded our RE year this week on April 20, with a class before Mass from 4:00 - 5:00 pm, followed by a 5:15 pm Mass. Our year was fast, but fruitful and fun. I am infinitely grateful to all of our students, catechists, families and St. John Evangelist staff for their time and dedication to growing together in our faith and love for Jesus and His church. Together our lives were enriched as we encountered the living love of God. My hope and prayer is that this is just the beginning of an "awemazing" journey of lifelong love and learning. Let us accompany one another and through our faith and service continue to "give thanks to the Lord, for He is good, His love is everlasting" (Psalm 118). Did you know....Criminal Background checks are conducted on every priest, deacon, parish director, employee and volunteer working with minors in active ministry in parish and schools in the Archdiocese of Milwaukee.


Did you know.... In 2020 in the Archdiocese, over 70 Safe Environment Education Sessions were conducted with over 1,800 adults trained, over 3,800 criminal background checks were conducted, and over 50,000 children were trained in Safe Environment topics.

Did you know....All clergy, employees and volunteers are instructed to contact local law enforcement or Child Protective Services immediately if they are made aware of a child being sexually abused,

Did you know....The Archdiocese has as Victim Assistance Coordinator that has assisted survivors of sexual abuse navigate through the process of reporting abuse and receiving counseling services. The Victim Assistance Coordinator can be reached at 414-758-2232.

Did you know....No priest of deacon with a substantiated allegation of sexual abuse of a minor can or will ever serve as a priest or deacon in the Archdiocese of Milwaukee.

Did you know....In the Archdiocese of Milwaukee, a Diocesan Review Board reviews allegations against clergy involving abuse of a minor and helps hold our diocese accountable.

Dear Padre,

My friend is doing a Bible study, and part of the program is something called *lectio divina*. Is that a Catholic practice?

This method of listening to Scripture has the Church's approval. In fact, Catholic bishops have recommended *lectio divina* as an easy way for Catholics to become more familiar with the Bible. The practice of *lectio divina* is quite simple:

First, ask the Holy Spirit to help you listen. Then slowly read a short Scripture passage aloud. Listen for a word or phrase that strikes you. Next, think about why this word or phrase is so striking at this moment. Does the word or phrase touch your life right now? Then, ask God's help in making an important choice, or ask what the word or phrase that struck you in the first step means in your life. Finally, close your eyes, let go of all thoughts, and remain silent before God.

These parts have a logical progression, but it's not a hard-and-fast method. People who have been doing *lectio divina* for a long time sometimes move back and forth between parts. If you practice *lectio divina* regularly, over time your understanding of God's word will deepen.

[Lectio divina] is first of all a matter of reading the biblical passage attentively—even more, I would say with "obedience" to the text, to understand what it means in and of itself. One then enters into dialogue with Scripture, so that those words become a cause for meditation and prayer.
