SUMMER TO-DO-LIST FOR FAMILIES:

Summer vacation time is almost here! This is a great time to do things as a family, make memories, and also grow closer to God. All too often summer goes by faster than expected and we're left feeling like we didn't get to do everything we wanted to do. Now is a great time to plan ahead. Sit down and create your summer to-do list and leave room to record your "God Sightings" on your list after the activity.



God-Sightings are everyday clues that God is present, passionate, and powerful. After doing some activity on your list, simply ask: "Where did we see God in this activity? Then record these God-Sightings on your list. Here are some ideas and some God related activities along with some God-Sighting questions to consider:

- Visit a local. state or national park.
 - What's your favorite thing that you see? How can you thank God for it?
- Have dessert before dinner.
 - How does it feel to mix it up? How does this relate to your friendship with God?
- Go to a museum
 - Create a list of all the exhibits you see. Thank God for all those who made this possible.
- Go on a picnic.
 - What do you see? Animals, plants, flowers, and so on? Thank God for them!
- Make ice cream from scratch.
 - As you create your ice cream, discuss what it would have been like to see God create.
- Go to a movie.
 - What do you think Jesus would think of this movie? What can you learn from it?
- Take a sunset walk or hike.
 - Name all the colors you see and thank God for the beauty.
- Camp out in the backyard or a camp ground.
 - Look at the sky and see what you can find in the stars. Thank God for his creation!
- Plan a one-day road trip.
 - Get a map, draw a circle within driving distance, close your eyes, and point. See where God wants you to explore!
- Volunteer Find a place to serve as a family.
 - Share what you learned with each other. Pray for those you helped.

Finally, before school starts again review your list and see all the things that you and your family did and all of the ways and places that you and your loved ones found God during this summer of 2022.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION UPDATE GRADES 7 - 12:

The readings selected by the Church for today's Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, invite us to ponder the mystery of the Trinity. Indeed, the Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) in paragraph 234 declares that "the Most Holy Trinity is the central mystery of Christian faith and life. It is the mystery of God in himself." Many saints over the centuries have tried using symbols to represent the Trinity, such as the



triangle, three circles, a shamrock, our index finger (three sections/phalanges but one finger), water in its three forms, but perhaps the clearest expression is found in St. Pope John Paul II's writing on the Trinity. He explains that "the Father pours Himself out in a total gift of love to the Son. The Son pours Himself out in a total gift of love to the Father and the Holy Spirit bursts forth/overflows as the fruit of their total, self-giving love." Therefore, he explains that the Trinity is a family revealing a "holy exchange of sacrificial love" and thus, the closest example for us of the Trinity is marriage between a man and a woman in self-donating love and from that, the gift of children. By virtue of our trinitarian Baptism, St. Paul today reminds us that "the love of God has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us." When we take the time to pray, ponder and reflect on this radical gift of love from God, it is life-changing! Take the time this week, to thank God for his selfless gift of love for you in the Trinity and then imitate that love by how you love the people in your lives....after all, since we are made in God's image and likeness, this is our calling and mission! See you at Mass!



Dear Padre,

My daughter is \$30,000 in debt. Last payday, she loaned a friend \$600 for his house payment. She lent the money because she heard at Mass that if you have money and your friend needs it, you should lend it. Is that what Jesus would suggest for my daughter's situation?

f your daughter had \$600 she didn't immediately need and was certain the friend would repay her in a timely fashion, yes, it was good for your daughter to have lent the money. It's a sign of your daughter's generosity and kindness.

But there are many "ifs" in the above scenario. If someone had lent that money to your daughter and, because she then lent it to her friend, the lender



was denied her payment in a timely fashion, your daughter shouldn't have lent the money.

Putting this idea in simpler terms, if I have two chickens and need only one for supper, I can give a hungry person the extra chicken. But I needn't give away all I have to feed the hungry, thus becoming hungry myself. If I have only one chicken, I don't have to give it away.

We're called to be generous, but not at the expense of our own wellbeing. Lending money is a different

issue because it seems everyone owes money. If your daughter is paying her debts in a timely fashion, she can continue to be generous.
