A little about me: I grew up on a very small dairy farm in Paris, Wisconsin (Kenosha County). All of my family still lives in the Racine and Kenosha areas. I have one younger sister, who is married with a daughter and a son. After high school, I attended Iowa State University with degrees in Dairy Science and Agricultural Business. In college I really developed a deep

friendship with Jesus that led me to consider a vocation of service, and eventually to the priesthood. Then, I went to Saint Francis de Sales Seminary in Milwaukee to begin my studies and preparation for the priesthood. With God's grace, I was ordained a priest in May 2019 and was assigned to St Peter in Slinger, St Lawrence, and Resurrection parishes as an Associate Pastor.

I'm eager to begin my time with you! I just ask for your patience with me as I learn the ways of our communities, (and for my own human adjustments to new people, new places!). Please pray for me and know that I pray for you all daily!

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION UPDATE GRADES 7 - 12:

Today we celebrate the 13th Sunday of Ordinary Time, but for the Church, "ordinary" does not mean boring, routine or humdrum! Rather, in our liturgical calendar, ordinary is from the Latin "ordo" which simply means "order or to count." During Ordinary Time, the Church celebrates the entire life of Christ as we continue to learn how to truly live as His disciples by striving to become more holy, prayerful and charitable in giving of



our time, talent and treasure. Discipleship is demanding, but as in today's Gospel we accept Jesus' request to "follow me."

This past week, many young people have done just that during our At Home Mission Week. Throughout June 20-23, middle school and HS students spent hot days doing yard work, pulling weeds, cleaning windows, cleaning classrooms at St. Dominic's Faith Formation building, picking up lots of sticks and tree limbs at Calvary Cemetery, painting and other jobs for some of our elderly parishioners. There were many schools represented such as Sheboygan North, Roncalli, Sheboygan Christian, Elkhart Lake, Oostburg, Sheboygan Falls and homeschoolers. Many new friendships were made as children and adult helpers came together to help put our faith into action. Our RE program also hosted our first of three "class before Mass" summer programs on Saturday, June 25, with a presentation by Sr. Mary Teresa, OSF from the Franciscan Sisters of Christian Charity in Manitowoc, WI. Yes, discipleship can be demanding, but it can also be fun, since by following Jesus there never really is ordinary time, just a life of freedom, gratitude and JOY! Now that is extra ordinary!! Summertime:



We have reached the end of the school year and the beginning of summer (The summer i solstice was this past Tuesday.) The temperatures are hotter, pools are open, and i schedules shift into a more relaxed mode, with travel, vacations, cookouts, and family gatherings. Summer is also a great time to come to Sunday (or Saturday evening) Mass i and to find a regular time to pray together as a family, or by yourself.

Here's a simple aid to prayer that has been popularized by Pope Francis. It's perfect for !children, whatever their age and even for adults, because with a little practice almost anyone can remember this simple formula - just use the thumb/fingers on one hand to recall the various intentions:

- $^{!}$ 1. The thumb is the closest finger to you. So, start praying for those who are closest to you. They are $^{!}$ the people easiest to remember. To pray for our dear ones is a "good obligation."
- 2. The next finger is the index finger. Pray for those who teach you, instruct you, and heal you. They need God's help as they offer direction for others.
- The following finger is the tallest. It reminds us of our government leaders and others who have authority. They need God's guidance.
- 4. The fourth finger is the ring finger, which is also our weakest finger. It should remind us to pray for! the weakest among us—the sick, the poor, those excluded from society, and those plaqued by other problems.
- 5. And finally, we have our smallest finger. This finger should remind you to pray for yourself. When you are done praying for the other four groups, you will be able to pray for your own needs in a better way.

The upcoming weeks will, no doubt, bring new opportunities to become aware of our loving God and to reach out and care for others. May these days and weeks bring you peace and good health, and may you truly enjoy the many blessings of the summer.


PASTORAL 2nd ANNUAL COUNCIL BREWER GAME TRIP:

Dear Padre,

After Mass, someone told me she overheard some people speaking wrongly about me. She defended me but wouldn't say what was said, or by whom. This troubles me. How should I deal with it?

irst, consider why indulging in gossip is so prevalent. People leading uneventful lives often have an unhealthy interest in others' affairs, and they desire to gossip about it. Those who consider themselves to be poor conversationalists may gossip to feel important by imparting information that is seemingly in demand. Others resort to character assassinations out of jealousy or envy.

Because gossip easily spreads into a distortion of the truth, it can be, as Pope Francis said, "a plague more awful than COVID!" Some people permissibly spread gossip only when the truth of the rumor has been verified; for others, the truth of the matter is irrelevant. Regardless, when people gossip about us behind our backs—depriving us of our own input and version of the truth—we can feel victimized and defenseless.



Yet we aren't completely powerless. Just because something is perceived as the truth about us doesn't mean we have to accept it as such. (Nevertheless, in cases when we know what is said, we should honestly ask ourselves if there's any truth to it.) While we have no control over what people say about us, we can ultimately

decide how much attention a rumor deserves—and generally, the less time and energy we devote to rumors, the better we are!
