On August 9, we celebrate the Memorial of **Saint Teresa Benedicta of the Cross**. She was a Jewish convert to Catholicism who eventually became a Carmelite nun and was eventually arrested and executed at the Auschwitz concentration camp. While her courage and faith until the end of her life earned her a martyr's crown, she lived a remarkable life before her imprisonment. Before converting to Catholicism, she was an ardent student of philosophy. In many ways, she came to know God through her intellect. An incredibly gifted woman, she used her brain to come to know God. Her

life teaches us that our belief in God and our Catholic faith is intelligent. If we are experiencing doubts in our faith, we should ask for Saint Teresa to pray for us. We can follow her example and use our intelligence and intellectual ability to seek and find truths about God.

The Feast of Saint Lawrence is August 10. I don't have a lot to write about him this year except for this: He is the patron saint of comedians. Why? Lawrence was a martyr who was put to death by being burned on a grill. Legend has it, he told his executioners, "Turn me over, I'm done on this side." Even if it's not true, Lawrence's calmness in the face of death must have made an impact on his fellow Christians. Let us ask Saint Lawrence to help us to laugh occasionally at our own suffering and trials.

Finally, some practical things.

I do not keep strict **office hours**, but generally I am at Blessed Trinity in the mornings on Tuesdays and Thursdays and afternoons on Wednesdays and Fridays. I try to be at St John in the mornings on Wednesdays and Fridays, and afternoons on Tuesdays and Thursdays. If you're looking for me for a quick comment or phone call, that's usually where you'll find me.

RAISING CHILDREN WHO CARE

How do you raise children who care? One of the first and most important steps is to nurture their ability to feel empathy. The good news for parents, teachers and other adults is that empathy arises naturally in most children at an early age and is easily nurtured through fun family activities done together. You don't have to go looking for special events or situations to make this happen. Children receive the best education during normal daily situations when adults are actively engaged in their lives. Here are a few suggestions:



Read stories and watch movies together.

Occasionally stop and ask children, "How do you think this character feels?" There is no right answer. The point is to encourage empathetic feelings and reflection. Such questioning will give them opportunities to develop an ability to sense the feelings of others. It can also help them to base their future actions on compassion rather than self-centeredness.

Allow children to fully declare their feelings when they're having a difficult time with a sibling or friend.

Ask your child if they can also express what the other person might be feeling and why. The point of this activity is not to put down or dismiss your child's feelings but to widen his or her sense of all that is truly going on in the situation.

Create a safe climate for children to take responsibility for their actions—both good and bad.

There is no more effective facilitator of moral development than fostering children's willingness to take responsibility for good and bad deeds. You can encourage this willingness by responding calmly and evenly when your child admits to misdeeds. When your response is expressed in a calm way your child can still experience the consequences of those misdeeds, including your measured expression of disappointment or anger. This helps children develop a willingness to admit mistakes. Always defending a child when disagreements or misdeeds occur can inhibit moral growth and development.

Be a good listener.

- 1. Look your children in the eye when they are talking to you. Don't try to multi-task.
- 2. Repeat without judgment what they've said. This shows you're listening to hear and not to defend or instruct.
- Be patient when listening. Speaking too soon can shut off communication rather than further it.
- 4. Ask open-ended questions (without judgment) to learn more.
- 5. Share your experience and values rather than just your advice.
- 6. Remember to say a quick prayer when first approached by your child. Pray for the ability to listen with an open heart.

Taking time for open conversation with your children and answering their questions honestly, provides endless opportunities to talk about caring and respecting others. **Finally**, and most importantly, simply lead by example and you'll accomplish a lot!

The point in relation to today's readings, money will come and go; awards will tarnish; possessions can be stolen or destroyed, but what lasts are relationships with God and others; the love we give away and the faith that we treasure and trust. Dear Padre,

When I was young, we never had eucharistic devotions. Why are they so popular now?

Prior to the Second Vatican Council, many Catholics found solid food for their spiritual lives in eucharistic devotions, which include visiting the Blessed Sacrament (eucharistic adoration), attending Forty Hours devotion,

and assisting at benediction of the Blessed Sacrament.

However, as the modern liturgical movement began picking up steam, scholars and theologians began questioning the amount of energy and attention going toward eucharistic devotion. They urged us to focus our spirituality more clearly on the Mass—the action of the sacred liturgy and the Eucharist itself—and to understand that all eucharistic devotions outside of the sacred liturgy are meant to direct us back to the action of the Mass, the eucharistic sacrifice, and its high point of Communion.



The drop-off in eucharistic

devotions after Vatican II can be positively understood as an attempt to take the insights of liturgical reform seriously and develop a more liturgical piety. At the same time, the resurgence of eucharistic adoration is a worthy retrieval of a beloved practice that both scholars and the faithful understand as complementing a full, conscious, and active participation in the sacred liturgy that is the "source and summit" of our lives.
