From Father Schmeckel:

Last week, I began a series of articles about Eucharistic Prayer I (sometimes called the Roman Canon). This is part 2. Please see the bulletin from August 21 for the first part, available online.

We left off at the words that are used to ask God to bless the offering of bread and wine that will become the Body and Blood of our Lord. At this point, the priest prays:

"...which we offer you firstly for your holy catholic Church.



Be pleased to grant her peace, to guard, unite and govern her throughout the whole world..."

We ask God to protect the Church throughout the whole world. After we address our prayer to God, we still have a "big" vision for our prayer at Mass. We ask God to bless all peoples everywhere. We ask God to care for and protect the Church in every corner of the globe. We ask God to give peace. There is a universal vision to our prayer, and this should shape how we think and pray during Mass. Do we "think big" in our prayer at Mass? In the way we pray for others, in our love for Him, in our care for one another, do we think in a large way about what God is capable of doing in our world and in our hearts?

The Eucharistic Prayer continues:

"...together with your servant Francis our Pope and Jerome our Bishop..."

In our prayer, we pray for and mention the Pope by name. When we pray for Pope Francis at a each and every Mass, we have a visual image of the worldwide Church. When we hear "Francis our Pope" at Mass, we might imagine the pictures or videos we have seen of Pope Francis. He is the pope of all the world. That image in our mind reminds us in a tangible way to pray for and think of the worldwide Church. Then, we pray for our specific Archbishop, Jerome Listecki. When we hear his name, it reminds us that God isn't just a vague and invisible idea but comes and works in specific concrete places and times. God wants to work in a very real way in the Archdiocese of Milwaukee, in each specific area, in each corner of Kohler and Sheboygan Falls. While God reigns over all of creation, he also cares uniquely about and loves each of us individually. How have we experienced God's love in grand and large ways? How have we experienced God's love in specific and small ways?



The New School Year

The start of the new 2022-23 School Year is right around the corner. August is nearing an end and vacation-time is winding down. As most parents/grandparents and others know, getting children ready to return to school can be a challenge. One of the best things parents and caregivers can do for children, is to establish some clear routines. Consistency is important. Here are some suggestions:



In finding a routine that works, designate time for sports practices and other outside activities, as well as things like family meals. Getting outside or playing games after dinner is a great way to spend time with one another and take a "brain break". This can be good for adults as well and can help to transition into homework time for the whole family. Having a dedicated space in common rooms of a home can help children stay focused on their homework. This also allows parents to see what their students are doing and what they're learning.

Having a regular bedtime can also benefit children. Setting out the things that children will need the next day in a designated space, or having older children do this themselves, the night before, can help to lessen stress in the morning. Checking the student's backpack every day is one way parents can learn a lot about what happens at school. Reading e-mail from school personnel is a must. The school website should also be checked frequently.

Beyond the regular bed time, creating an environment of rest for children can help to ensure they are sleeping and growing well. If possible, don't let them go to their rooms with their screens. Research shows that the blue light from screens sends signals to the brain that it is daytime, making it more difficult for children, and adults as well, to wind down and sleep.

Finally, and most importantly, don't forget family prayer. Make the Sunday Mass an essential family experience. This is one of the best ways to foster faith in children throughout the school year and beyond.....

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION UPDATE GRADES 7 - 12:

Today's readings on this 22nd Sunday of Ordinary Time speak of the virtue of humility! The Latin origin of humility is "humilis" which means "low" and though it may seem outdated, it is the highest of all the virtues and the opposite of the deadly sin of pride or arrogance. To be humble does not mean to feel unworthy



or likely to fail, but quite the contrary. To be truly humble is to be confident and to recognize that everything I have is a gift from God and that without Him, I can do nothing. With a spirit of humility, we recognize that we will struggle and sometimes fail, but that simply means our First Attempt In Learning!! In Luke's Gospel today, we see the kind of humility that Jesus expects from us as we seek daily to imitate Him and His example. It is essentially to think of others first, yourself last and God always, aka JOY! Our Catholic faith should orient us towards heaven and so it is countercultural to what this world offers. We have a paradoxical faith where we hear such things as "the last will be first and the first will be last" (Mt. 20:16); "for when I am weak, then I am strong" (2Cor12) and "for everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, but the one who humbles himself will be exalted." (Lk. 14:11). Perhaps you tend to think that a humble person is like a doormat, who gets walked on, but the truth is that true humility requires great strength! Get that? Another paradox!! This week, look up online the "Litany of Humility" or "Mother Teresa's Humility List." If you are like me, several of these won't be easy, but by choosing to put others ahead of yourself and striving to love God always and every day, we are more free to love our neighbor and to give more freely, without counting the cost! August 28 is usually the feast of St. Augustine of Hippo. Like all saints, he was a sinner saved by grace (and by the fervent prayers of his mother, St. Monica, whose feast day is August 27). He was a Bishop and is a Doctor of the Church and he lived a life that eventually led to true humility and ultimate holiness. Get to know the lives of the Saints, since they give us hope that God can do great things with us, if we humble ourselves and admit that we too are sinners in need of a Savior! See you at Mass.


