From Father Schmeckel:

We continue our reflections and considerations about the Eucharistic Prayer. At this point, I should clarify something. By these reflections that I am offering, I am not suggesting that you need to think and pray about each and every single word and idea in the prayer. Rather, if one or two ideas stick with you, you could use those to help you to pray better and pay closer attention to the prayers of the Mass. With that caveat, let's continue with the words of the first Eucharistic Prayer where we left off last week. The priest continues praying:



"...for the redemption of their souls, in hope of health and well-being, and paying their homage to you, the eternal God, living and true."

That first line should cause us to pause. What is our highest hope for the people we pray for at Mass? For the redemption of their souls. The Second Vatican Council wanted to focus on this when the Council Fathers wrote and spoke about the liturgy. First and foremost, the Mass is about worship of God. The second purpose of the Mass is the sanctification of humanity. It means that we pray for Grandma, Mom and Dad, our coworkers, our friends, and ourselves so that we become holy. Of course, health and well-being are important things to pray for, but more importantly is getting to heaven. At every Mass, we pray for the redemption of the souls of those we pray for.

Then, the priest continues the prayer:

"In communion with those whose memory we venerate, especially the glorious ever-Virgin Mary, Mother of our God and Lord, Jesus Christ, and blessed Joseph, her spouse, your blessed Apostles and Martyrs, Peter and Paul, Andrew, James, John, Thomas, James, Philip, Bartholomew, Matthew, Simon and Jude; Linus, Cletus, Clement, Sixtus, Cornelius, Cyprian, Lawrence, Chrysogonus, John and Paul, Cosmas and Damian and all your Saints..."

That first line says it all: In communion with those whose memory we venerate. When we come to the Mass, we are not alone. We are joined in prayer by Mary, the Mother of Jesus, and Saint Joseph, and all of the Apostles, Saints and Martyrs of every age. This should be a great encouragement to us if we are saddened or feel alone in our lives. Even at our worst moments, we are never alone. These words of the Eucharistic Prayer remind us of our heavenly friends and the supernatural character of every Mass.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION UPDATE 4K - GRADE 6:

This past Wednesday, we held our first Religious Education Family Mass of this 2022-23 school year. Fr. Schmeckel celebrated the Mass and asked all children, teens and adults present to do three things this year and beyond: to attend Mass every Sunday; to pray for 5 minutes every day; and to carry a rosary. Great goals for this new year!



This coming Wednesday our students will attend their first Religious Education classes of this 2022-23 school year. Our Volunteer Catechists and Program Assistants will be ready to greet them, and to help "plant the seeds of faith" within them. We are expecting more than 70 4K-Grade 6 children.

From now until May we will have three "In-School" classes each month. Our Religious Education Program begins at 4:00 PM. when all children come into Church to learn and pray together. Then students and Teachers/Catechists go to their classrooms until classes end at 5:15 PM. This enables us to meet the Archdiocesan requirements of approximately 25 to 30 hours of Religious Education Instruction per year for children enrolled in our program.

We are grateful for our Teacher/Catechists and Program Assistants: Lorrie Free, Lori Lee, Patti Wenberg, Rich Tauferner, Delair Avery, Crystal Perez, Meriel Radloff, Susan Vavra and Substitute Steve Kovacs, and thank them for their willingness to share their faith and help parents keep the promises that they made when their children were baptized.

As we know, it takes all of us, parishioners, parents/grandparents/family members, Teachers/Catechists and other program support volunteers, to teach and nurture our children. RELIGIOUS EDUCATION UPDATE GRADES 7 - 12:

On this 24th Sunday of Ordinary Time, our readings today focus on the absolute, crazy, extravagant, radical, divine mercy of God! In our first reading from Exodus, we have the beautiful exchange between God and Moses about the depravity and lack of trust by the Israelites (after all God had done



for them!) culminating with the final sentence "so the Lord relented in the punishment he had threatened to inflict on his people." (Ex.32:14). Then we have Paul's first letter to Timothy where Paul admits that he is a sinner saved by grace and that "Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners" (1Tm1:15). Then our Gospel today from Luke is the familiar parable of the Prodigal son. Though we may have heard this story countless times, never take for granted the absolute, crazy, extravagant, radical, divine mercy of the Father! With today also being the 21st anniversary of 9/11, we understand that our world has suffering, violence and brokenness, but we can never give into despair or fear! Our readings and our faith remind us that God is ALWAYS present and that He always has a rescue plan, though we may not see it or understand it at the time. Did you hear that amid the carnage of the Twin Towers in New York City, a 20-foot tall steel-beam cross was found, along with other crosses randomly at the base of it? Several days later, firefighters and engineers realized that the beams came from the two different buildings and when they crashed into each other, they formed a cross, forged by the intensity of the explosion. Was that a random occurrence? I like to think that it was a reminder to "be not afraid, I am with you" and that in the midst of all the chaos and confusion, God is present. And you know what? God is present right now in your life and in the Eucharist that we receive at every Mass. So, even if our lives are messy, broken, and complicated, we can recall today's Psalm 51 and "let us rise and go to our Father" and there we will find that absolute, crazy, extravagant, radical, divine mercy of God! See you at Mass.





Dear Padre,

My child's godparents make no attempt to build a special relationship with her. I've talked to them about it, but it didn't help. Can I replace them?

hen my niece, Hayley, was five, she asked me to be her "step-godfather" because she didn't know who her godfather was. The family friend my sister invited to be Haley's godfather has moved out of state and seems to have forgotten that Haley is his godchild.

Godparents have responsibilities beyond baptism day. The Code of Canon Law says a godparent also "helps the baptized person to lead a Christian life in keeping with baptism and to fulfill faithfully the obligations inherent in it" (872). A godparent should be present for the child's first Communion and encourage the child to live a Christian life as he or she grows older.

While neglectful godparents may not be replaced, parents are not limited to asking only two godparents to help their child grow in the faith. "The whole ecclesial community bears some responsibility for the development and safeguarding of the grace given at baptism" (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 1255). Parents can and should ask others to help support their child's



faith development as he or she grows up: a teacher, a grandparent, or a friend in the town where your child has gone away to college. After all, children are baptized into a community of believers, and we all have the responsibility to help children—and one another—lead Christian lives.
