EUKE 21:19, NRSV

From Father Schmeckel:

As we approach the end of the Church's calendar year, you might notice that **the readings both at weekday and Sunday Masses are quite intense**. In today's Gospel, we hear Jesus say, "Nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom...." And ".....they will seize and persecute you, they will hand you over to the synagogues and prisons, and they will have you led before kings and governors because of my name." And again, "You will be hated by all because of my name..."



Next Sunday, on the Feast of Christ the King of the Universe, we will hear the account of Jesus' Death on the Cross. As I write these words, I do not know what my homilies will be about, but I confess to a feeling of "oofta" in preparing to pray with the words and actions of our Lord in a way that leads each of us to a deeper love of Him in our daily lives. Over the course of these two weeks, let us pray that our hearts will be open to whatever our Lord wants us to hear. Even if the readings seem to be too much "fire and brimstone", Jesus desires to speak to us in this intensity because of His love for us. We ask for His help to listen to Him carefully!

In my own prayer in the last number of weeks, I have often returned to a recent homily from Pope Francis. He said the following:

"May the Church be overcome with joy. If she should fail to rejoice, she would deny her very self, for she would forget the love that begot her. Yet how many of us are unable to live the faith with joy, without grumbling or criticizing? A Church in love with Jesus has no time for quarrels, gossip, and disputes. May God free us from being critical and intolerant, harsh and angry! This is not a matter of style, but of love."

In my own heart, I recognize that I waste a lot of time grumbling, or complaining, or being critical and angry! As Pope Francis has said so beautifully, if we are in love with Jesus, we have no time for these things! Let us intentionally pray for each other in the week ahead that we "live the faith with joy" and that we fall in love with Jesus more and more each day.




Dear Padre,

I was taught that when we die, we will spend some time in purgatory and then go on to heaven. I notice some of our hymns say we will be raised on the last day. I'm confused.

t is not surprising that there is confusion about the issue. There is a difference between judgment and resurrection, even though they are obviously connected. Some people think of these two things occurring at the same time. Our Catholic teaching separates them, to some extent.

The teaching says there are two kinds of judgment. The first is that which occurs at our death and is called "the particular judgment." In this judgment



we may go to heaven, hell, or purgatory. The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* puts it this way: "Each man receives his eternal retribution in his immortal soul at the very moment of his death, in a particular judgment that refers his life to Christ" (*CCC* 1022).

The second judgment is the general judgment that occurs at the end of the world. The resurrection of the body will take place at this judgment when our particular judgment is confirmed and our soul and body are reunited. The hymns that say we will be raised on the last day refer to the general judgment, as do most of the Scripture passages about judgment.
