

#### **From Father Schmeckel:**

Today, we celebrate the Feast of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. This feast day was inserted into our church's calendar in 1925 by Pope Pius XI. In the reforms of the Second Vatican Council in the 1960s, it was moved to the last Sunday of the church's liturgical year. This means that each year begins with celebrating the preparation for and birth of Jesus the Infant King and ends with celebration of his reign as King over entire universe.



As I prepare my homily for this great celebration, one question continues to

surface in my heart: Is Jesus the King of my heart? Most of us reading this (me included) might be quick to answer "yes" to this question, but, as we celebrate this feast day and slowly begin our preparations for Advent and Christmas, the question in our hearts might change. Is He really the King of my heart?

When I wake up in the morning, are my first thoughts about Jesus? As I go throughout the day, is Jesus the King of my thoughts, words, and actions? This doesn't mean that every conversation has to explicitly include Jesus, but He should influence everything that we do. When we daydream or sit and rest, does it lead us to Jesus? When we send e-mails or texts - is Jesus the King of our words? Do the choices and actions we make at work, at church in school or with our friends, families and others - reflect the love of Jesus our King?

When we examine our calendars and our bank accounts – do they reveal that Jesus is King of our resources? Again, this doesn't mean that we have to give all of our money and every waking moment to the church and to charities, but do the ways money and times is spent show in a real way that Jesus is the only King of my heart? (My take: Taking time to push your children on the swing after a long day of work does show your love for the King, and making sure that your family is safe, well-fed, and provided for does show your love for Jesus in a special way)

As we enter the holiday seasons of Thanksgiving, Advent, and Christmas, I invite you to spend a few quiet moments at the end of the day and ask yourself: Was Jesus the King of my Heart today, and if not, how can He enter into my life and reign and rule more tomorrow?

#### **RELIGIOUS EDUCATION UPDATE GRADE 7-12:**

Today we celebrate the last Sunday of our liturgical year, the solemn Feast of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe!! Most of us have a vision of what it means to be a King, especially after the recent funeral of Queen Elizabeth II in England, we have a picture of what royalty, monarchs and kingdoms should look like. But Jesus is no ordinary, earthly

what royalty, monarchs and kingdoms should look like. But Jesus is no ordinary, earthly king. In fact, kingdom in Latin is "basilia" from where we get the word "basilica" and it means "royal nature." So God's Kingdom is not a palace or place, but rather it is about His royalty or His royalness! What does this look like? It is truly the gifts and fruits of the Holy Spirit, found in Is. 11:1-2 and Gal. 5:20-22; courage, wisdom, knowledge, understanding, peace, love, patience, joy, faithfulness, to name just a few. For God is no ordinary King, even the three Kings at Bethlehem recognized this and when they came with their gifts, they went home by another way. Why? Because no one can encounter the loving, living person of Jesus and remain the same. How blessed we are to have such a humble King who adopts us as His royal family at our Baptism. Do you think of yourself as royalty? As God's beloved prince or princess, sons and daughters of the King of Kings? Well you should, because you are!!

My daughter Regina (Latin for Queen) teaches 4-8th grade at a Christian Brothers Catholic school on the Blackfeet Indian reservation in Montana. She told me a story that during Holy Week one year, she was asking her students what the "INRI" at the top of every crucifix means. We know it was placed there by Pilate to tell all of the passersby that this crucified man was "Jesus of Nazareth, King of the Jews." Of course, none of her students knew this and though she got some flippant answers, one shy girl raised her hand and said that it stood for "I never regretted it." Out of the mouths of babes, for you see, THIS is the kind of God, the kind of King that we worship and adore....one who would take our place, so that we could be eternally with Him in His Kingdom called "heaven." How great thou art!! See you at Mass.





## Dear Padre,

Can all good people go to heaven after they die, even if they haven't been a Christian? My dad is from India and grew up with another religion. The rest of my family is Catholic. I am afraid that we won't see each other again after we die.

ut your mind at ease. A person who is a not a Christian can go to heaven. Heaven is not just for Christians, but for everyone who loves God and responds to God's will in his or her life.

We know that God wants all people to be saved, not just Christians. Jesus began a Church to help people achieve salvation. The Church teaches that those who seek "the truth and [do] the will of God in accordance with their understanding of it can be saved" (*Catechism of the Catholic Church*, 1260). What we know as Catholics is that God called us into the Church. It is there that we will work out our salvation. "Since Christ died for all, and since all are called to one and the same destiny, which is divine," we must believe that the Holy Spirit makes a way for everyone, a way that only God knows (*CCC* 1260).

You should pray for your dad and be a faithful Catholic. Perhaps your good example will help him become a Christian. Even if he never becomes a Christian, your prayers will help him work out his salvation without the benefit of the sacraments and a believing community. If he does what is right, God will reward him.
