

From Father Schmeckel:

We have one more week of Advent to prepare for Christmas and the coming of Jesus. On the First Sunday of Advent, I proposed two questions in my homily: What is one habit the Lord is asking you to stop doing? What is one habit the Lord is asking you to start doing to grow in holiness and friendship with Him? This is to serve as a little reminder to think about those habits. Even if you have fallen behind or completely forgot, you can still begin again today to invite Jesus deeper into your heart and your life!



This week, we will offer the Sacrament of Reconciliation in abundance. Every day this week except Monday, confessions will be heard in one of our parishes – at a wide variety of times of day. I encourage you to make use of these opportunities to receive God's mercy, love, and grace. Even if you haven't murdered anyone or stolen anything, this sacrament gives us the grace to overcome even small or venial sins with Jesus' help. To that end, I would like to provide some of the "nuts and bolts" in case it has been a while since your last confession or if you are nervous about doing this:

- 1. Enter confessional.
- 2. Father usual starts with the sign of the cross or "hello"
- 3. Say, "Forgive me, Father, it's been (x days, months, years) since my last confession"
- 4. Or, if it's been a while, say "It's been a while since my last confession." Father will help you.
- 5. State your sins and things that you've done wrong.
- 6. Father might ask a few questions to clarify and to give you a piece of advice or encouragement.
- 7. Father will give you a penance (often, a prayer) to help make up for the things we've done wrong.
- 8. Say the Act of Contrition (a copy will be available in all of our confessionals)
- 9. Father will pray the Prayer of Absolution, "I absolve you..." He will then tell you to, "Go in peace, and sin no more".

If you are nervous about going to confession, it might be helpful to remember that **priests also get nervous about confession**. I often get nervous to go to confession because I know that I am a sinner in need of God's mercy; plus, as a priest, it's unlikely that the priest doesn't know me! But, I know, this sacrament helps me grow in holiness and is a very necessary part of my regular spiritual life.

I also get nervous to hear confessions. This might sound odd at first, however, the Sacrament of Reconciliation is an encounter with God Himself. He might use my voice, it is really God to whom we confess our sins. To be an instrument of that, to help people in their friendship with God is a grave and serious task in the life of a priest! So, don't be too nervous because **God is good and wants to invite you into a deeper friendship with Him!**

Come, Lord Jesus!



Presence: The Mystery of the Eucharist Episode 1: God is with Us

Join us for part one of three of a wonderful program about the Eucharist at a convenient time after Mass, with light refreshments. We finish by 11:00 am in time for other Sunday plans.

Dear Padre,

My children, who go to Catholic school, refer to our Sunday celebration as the "Eucharist." I grew up calling it the "Mass." Why the difference?

Eucharist comes from the Greek word eucharistein. This word simply means "to give thanks." In the Eucharist we Catholics celebrate, we give thanks to God for giving us Jesus. We also give thanks to Jesus, who shares his Body and Blood with us. "Eucharist" was used to describe the early Church's gathering, where the people repeated the stories of the Lord and shared the bread and wine, as the Lord commanded them to do.



The word mass comes from the Latin word missa, which means "the sending." This refers to the words of dismissal at the end of Mass. The priest or deacon invites us to "go in peace to love and serve the Lord." In the Latin Mass, this phrase is "ite missa est." No one quite knows why the Eucharist came to be known as the "missa" or "mass." Some think it is because of the way monastic prayers were conducted in the early Middle Ages. When the monks gathered for prayers, they often concluded with a short eucharistic celebration. These celebrations sometimes lasted only ten minutes or so, and as they marked the end of the whole set of prayers, they signaled the end of the service. This, it is suggested, is why the Eucharist came to be known as the "dismissal," or the "Mass." •
