

**Thank you for being a Minister at the Weekend and Special Masses.
February – July, 2020**

This Ministry Schedule is for the next six months, February thru July, 2020. We have tried to schedule you once a month over the next six months. As you can see, you are scheduled for the same weekend each month. Hopefully, this will be helpful to you. If you are scheduled more than once a month, it is because you are down for more than one ministry or we were short on ministers. As we have more ministers sign-up we will put you down only once.

Weekend Masses at Christ the King Parish are on Saturday evening at 5 PM and at 10 AM on Sunday at St. Ferdinand Church and Sunday at 7:30 AM at St. Henry Church. We have scheduled ministers for the following special days: Ash Wednesday, February 26th; Holy Thursday, April 9th; Good Friday, April 10th, Holy Saturday, April 11th; Easter, April 12th (we have an additional Mass this Sunday and different Mass times – **Please check the special day schedule**); Confirmation will be April 26th at 1 PM; First Communion will be at the 7:30 AM and the 10 AM Masses on May 3rd, (we will keep the same Weekend Ministry Schedule for First Communion). Please check these special dates to see if you are scheduled and also where and when these Masses are. **If you are unable to be a minister, please find a substitute.**

Greeters: If you are down as a family for the weekend – please try to take 2 of the entrances. Prayer petitions can be found on the tables.

Lectors: Lector Workbooks are in the sacristy.

Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion:

Ministers of the Bread: You will be staying on the same weekend each month. The only change will be rotating you so you will not always be doing bread or wine. You will need to watch the Ferdinand News, and/or check the sign in sheet when you sign in. **Also attached is an updated Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion informational sheet.**

Ministers of the Cup: When purifying the cup between each communicant please be careful not to get it too far down into the cup as the purificator cloth will soak up the precious blood. When your cup is empty please lay the purificator over the top of the cup, so people are aware that your cup is empty.

When communion is finished, please consume the precious blood at the station you are serving. If you are unable to consume the precious blood, ask another minister to help you. ***Then place the cup on the altar and lay the purificator aside of the cup, not on top.*** If you are under the age of 21, you may distribute the precious blood, but should not consume it, please ask another minister to consume the precious blood for you.

Ushers: If there are a number of people standing in the cry-room, please help them find a seat in the main body of Church. (According to the Fire Marshall no one is to be standing in the cry-room or sitting on the stairs.)

Sign-in sheets for Lectors, Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, and Servers are in the sacristy. Sign-in sheets for Ushers, and Greeters are available in the back of Church. **Please sign in before Mass so we know if everyone is at Mass or if we need to look for someone to take your place.**

If you are unable to keep your scheduled time, please switch with someone or find a substitute.

(Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion)

As the ordinary ministers of Holy Communion, the normal role of a priest during Communion is to distribute the Precious Body, and the normal role of a deacon is the distribution of the Precious Blood. When there are not enough ordinary ministers, extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion would assist the priest(s) and deacon(s) in distributing the Precious Body or Precious Blood. In this role, extraordinary ministers should be open to distributing either species – whatever is needed to help the priest give Communion to the faithful in a timely manner. This applies both to those regularly scheduled ministers and those who are acting as a substitute, those who volunteer during Mass or are replacements for scheduled ministers who are unable to make it. Of course, some ministers may have valid reason for needing to distribute one species of the Sacrament in lieu of the other. If we know them before hand, we will certainly accommodate those needs whenever possible, just call the church office and let us know.

In order to create a consistency across the Parish in how ministers' function during Communion at Mass, and after consultation with the Diocese, we ask the following steps be observed.

1. The time to come forward is during the Sign of Peace. – Remain at the bottom of the steps in front of the altar until the presiding priest has consumed the Blood of Christ – Reverence the altar by bowing, and enter the sanctuary at this time. If needed one minister may go to the tabernacle to get the ciborium and take it to the altar. We will be putting sanitizer on each side of the church at the bottom of the sanctuary. Ministers should line up behind the priest, with a line for ministers of the Precious Blood in front of a line of ministers of the Precious Body behind them along with lectors and servers. One line is appropriate at St. Henry Church due to fewer ministers and space considerations.
2. After Communion all ministers of Holy Communion will remain at bottom step of the sanctuary and facing the altar until a minister has taken the ciborium to the tabernacle. When the minister reverences the tabernacle, all the ministers will reverence as well, by bowing, then can return to their pews.

An additional reminder, if you are minister of the Precious Body and a host is dropped please pick it up and put in your hand to consume later or if you do not want to consume it please give it to the priest to consume. If you are minister of the Precious Blood and for whatever reason there is some spilled, stand in front of it to protect the spill. After Communion has been offered to everyone, place the purificator over the spillage and tell the presiding priest or assisting deacon about the accident. Also, the presiding priest should be the minister who distributes the low gluten hosts, the congregation will be informed that he will be the station to go to if they need a reduced gluten host.

Again, we know it can be confusing when we have visiting priests and deacons, but as a reminder the role of the deacon is to distribute the Precious Blood, and priests normally distribute the Precious Body, and then the Precious Blood as needed. The Mass is a living thing and we ask that all ministers be willing to adjust if adjustments become necessary.
