

Sign up to be a greeter on the bulletin board outside the Office of Faith Formation. You must select any TWO Masses of your choosing from July 2 through Nov. 13th.

Arrive 20 minutes prior to Mass time, dressed appropriately. (no jeans, shorts, low-cut blouses, mini-skirts. If you are unsure of what's appropriate, ask at the Faith Formation office.)

Sign-in on the clipboard that will be in a basket/box with name tag lanyards at the entrance to the church.

Find and wear your name tag lanyard for the entire Mass.

Introduce yourself to an usher, (who are usually wearing maroon jackets) stating that are there to serve as part of your Confirmation service.

As they enter, greet parishioners with a smile as they enter "Good to see you", "Welcome to St. Pius" and hand them a missal.

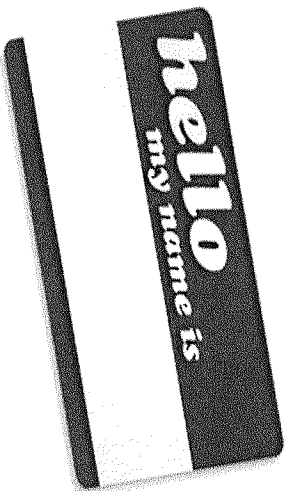
Follow the usher's instructions, you can help people find seats, help with collection, the gift, etc.

At the end of Mass, wish parishioners a nice day/evening ("Have a blessed day", "See you soon.") and collect missals and place on book rack, as well as hand out bulletins.

Help collect the missals/papers that were left in the rows and return kneelers to their proper position.

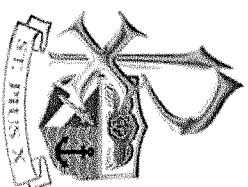
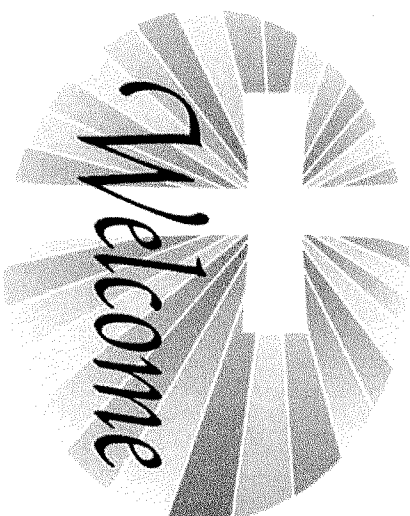
Return your name tag lanyard to the box/basket at the entrance to the church.
