

# KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS HISTORY

Part 7

HERE IS OUR STORY MONTH BY MONTH 1930-1940



The Great Depression initially had a detrimental effect on the Order's membership and finances, but it also led to a renewed sense of volunteer service. The success of an extensive membership campaign in 1935, titled Mobilization for Catholic Action, led to the establishment of the Order's Service Department, which subsequently launched a "Five-Point Program of Progress." The program encouraged councils to play a more active role in the life of the local parish and community, and included five categories: Catholic activity, council activity, fraternal protection, publicity and maintenance of manpower.

Also in the early 1930s, violent persecution resurfaced in Mexico, prompting the Order's leadership to strongly urge the U.S. government to take action. Tensions in Mexico eventually eased in 1937, but the threat of atheistic communism was growing in Europe. In response, the Knights organized anti-communist rallies in early 1937. When Pope Pius XI's encyclical on the subject, *Divini Redemptoris*, was released in March of that year, the Order printed and distributed a million copies. The Knights also sponsored a new lecture tour and expanded its anti-communism program to include a Crusade for Social Justice. "Injustice to man is the seed of communistic growth," Supreme Knight Martin Carmody said. "With Truth and Charity as your weapons, go forth as a Crusade."

# ANATOMY OF A PANCAKE BREAKFAST



This Edition of the “Pius Knight’s” newsletter I have dedicated to explaining how our Council puts on two major fundraisers each year. As you know we have two “James J. Maune Memorial Pancake Breakfasts” with Santa and the Easter Bunny. Since 2007 the Council has come together to raise money for Charity, Church, and Community. Thousands of Dollars and hundreds of hours have been donated since we started ten years ago. The event has had many different Chairmen, Workers, and Sponsors. It has evolved into a special event enjoyed by all. It has always been a TEAM effort to accomplish one of these much less two only a few months apart.

**IN THE BEGINNING:** During an Officers meeting at least a month before any batter hits the griddle the Officers of the Council come together to put the ducks in order. Committee Chairmen must volunteer. A date for the event is selected and has to be approved by our Pastor. Our schedules work around the Church’s. A flyer for the event is constructed, proof read, and submitted to the Rectory for approval and publication in the Church Bulletin. An updated poster board for the event is placed in the rear of the Church for all to see.

**SOLICITATION OF FOOD AND MANPOWER:** Council members must now secure donations of food and beverages for the event. The less the Council spends on the event the more money that can be given away. Local food stores, restaurants, and businesses are visited. After this is performed whatever that was not obtained must now be purchased, stored, and inventoried. A “Brothers-All” goes out to the membership for Manpower. Cash used for change must be obtained for the front door ticket chair and raffle 50/50.

**SET UP:** The day of set-up (Day before event) is a busy one. The food must be transported to the “Madonna Hall” kitchen. Kitchen utensils, display platters, and dishes are then washed. Boxes of fruits & vegetables must be cleaned, cut up, and placed on platters. Numerous eggs are cracked, strained, and stored in a proper container. Breakfast meats (Bacon-Sausage) are pre-cooked. Tables, chairs, and an “Omelet Station” are assembled. All tables are covered and decorative skirts are installed. Omelet Station burners, utensils, and essentials are removed from storage and transported to the Hall for assembly. Our St. Pius X Banner is assembled and installed in the Hall. Plates and utensils are assembled and positioned. Sterno cans are installed in the Chaffing dishes. Salt & Pepper shakers are filled and placed. Banners are tied up near Church.

**EVENT:** On The day of the event a large cooler chest is taken to a local business. It is filled with ice and two men are needed to transport it to “Madonna Hall”. Coffee and Hot Water is made. Kitchen stove burners are turned on. Pancake batter is prepared. Chaffing dishes are filled with water and Sterno cans lighted. Juice and omelet Station fixings are put on ice. Bagels, bread, cakes donated by Columbiettes, donuts, butter, cream cheese, and a micro wave are placed. The prepared fruit platters are brought to the tables. A front door ticket counter with 50/50 raffle table is put together and manned with tickets and cash box. The Omelet Station is supplied with eggs, cheese, canola oil, and the fixings. Prior to the start (usually right after the 8:30AM Mass) chaffing dishes are filled with Pancakes and breakfast meats. For the next (3) Hours food is prepared, served, and restocked continuously. The front door sells tickets, sells raffles, and stamps hands throughout the morning. The 50/50 is performed near the end of the day.

**CLEAN-UP:** After all of the Parish Faithful have been served and fed clean-up begins. All dishes, utensils, storage containers, and display basins are washed and dried. Tables are stripped of coverings and disassembly begins. Table skirts are folded and stored. Trash is bagged and carried to the dumpster. Spills are cleaned up and floors are swept. The Omelet Station is disassembled, cleaned, and loaded into a waiting vehicle for transport and storage. Our Banner is taken down, disassembled and stored. Unused food condiments are stored. Any foods that can be donated is wrapped and transported to the food bank recipient. The kitchen stove is disassembled and cleaned. Counters, tables, and appliances are wiped clean. Banners removed, tied up, stored.

**EPITAPH:** The “Pius Knights” volunteer for the event twice a year. They are proud to serve their Church, Charities, and Community. All of the “Brothers” who work these events purchase an admission ticket to the breakfast and there are no exceptions for this fundraiser. We encourage you to join us in this all hands endeavor for Charity. The more unified we are the more we can accomplish.





*The Shrine of Our Lady of the Island, conducted by the Montfort Missionaries is located on the eastern end of Long Island about sixty miles from New York City. Conceived in 1953 as a place of pilgrimage, actual construction began in 1972 on 65 acres of land donated by a generous benefactor.*

*An 18 foot statue of Mother and child, carved from a forty ton piece of granite at the Rock of Ages Studio in Vermont was added in 1975 and stands atop a glacial boulder of rose quartz that has re-mained in position for the past 15,000 years. It overlooks Moriches Bay and the Atlantic Ocean some five miles away.*
