Message From The Chaplain

Dear Brother Knights,

I read a story about an Ohio gentleman whose oil well caught fire and he put out an all-points bulletin for help, to make sure that anybody and everybody would come and help him he offered \$30,000.00 reward to whoever could put out the fire. All the large firehouses from cities like Newell, Chester, Wellsville, and Dillonsville sent help. They sent their best companies and the most modern fire-fighting equipment available. However, not one of the fire departments could get within 200 yards of the blaze because the heat was so intense and the fire was too big.
