In this Sunday's Gospel, we hear of St. John the Baptist's profession of faith that there was "one among you whom you do not recognize... whose sandal strap [he] is not worthy to untie." As we draw closer to the little town of Bethlehem, we cannot help but get excited for what is waiting for us. There is a constant temptation within our culture to develop prideful tendencies that put ourselves before all others. Pick one Mass to fulfill the Christmas Holy Day obligation: Sunday, December 24th at 5:00pm or Sunday, December 24th at 10pm, or Monday, December 25th at 10am.
