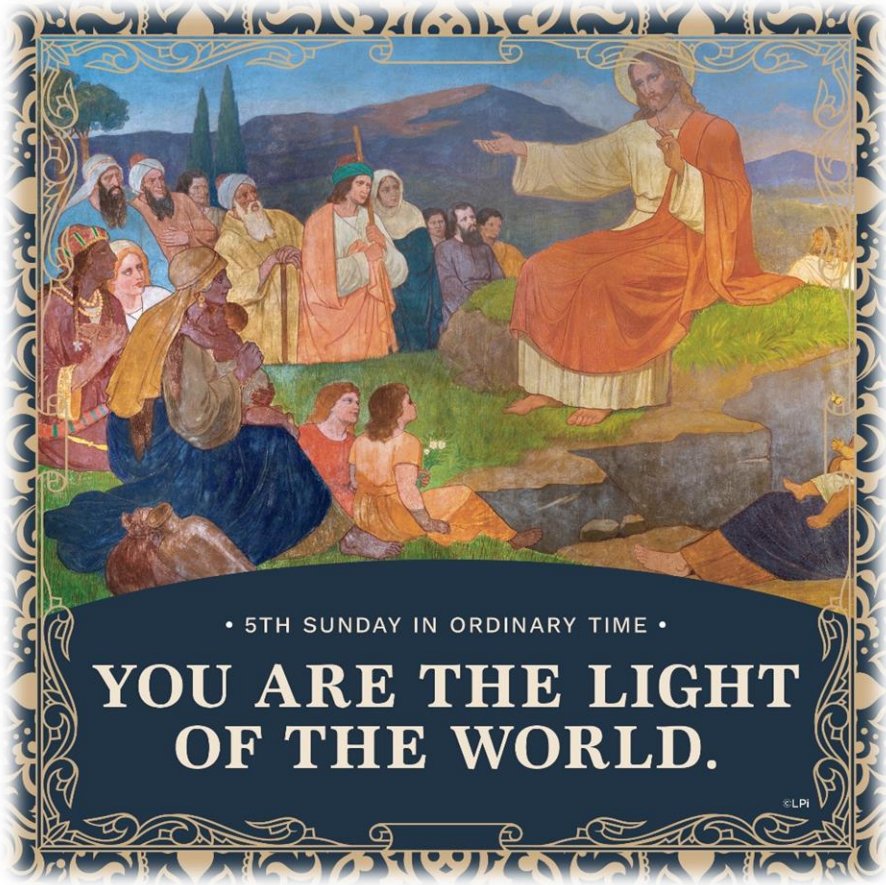

### FIRST READING: Isaiah 58:7-10



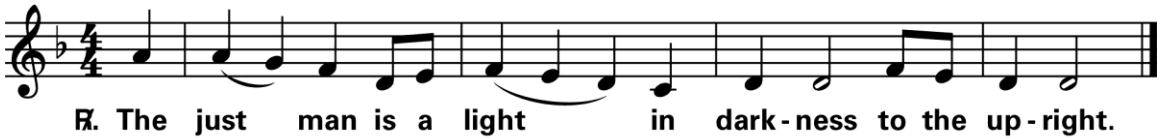
A reading from the Book of the prophet Isaiah.

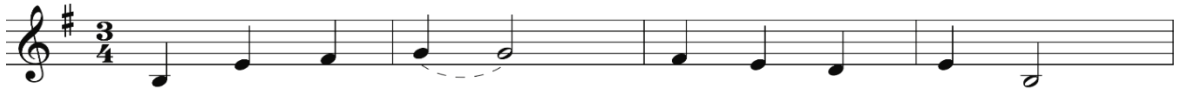
## **† PROFESSION OF FAITH**

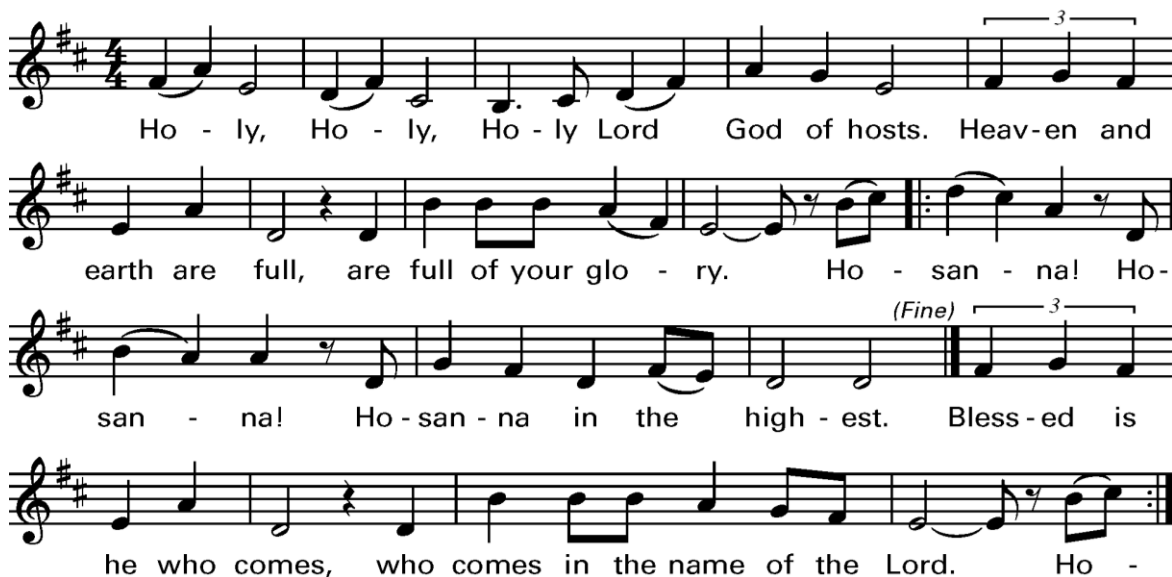


