




## THE LITURGY OF THE WORD


**FIRST READING:** Sirach 35:12-14, 16-18



Jesus addressed this parable to those who were convinced of their own righteousness and despised everyone else. "Two people went up to the temple area to pray; one was a Pharisee and the other was a tax collector. #### **PROFESSION OF FAITH**


