Mental Wellness Corner

The PATH to Calm: 4 Steps to calm your mind.

With practice, we can learn how to manage negative emotions in a healthy way. One helpful tool is to remember the word PATH. It stands for:

Pause: Don't immediately act on feelings, stop and think things through. Count to 100 or say the alphabet backwards. Acknowledge your feelings. For example, are you mad, or are you sad because your feelings were hurt by someone?

Think: Now that you've taken a moment to understand your feelings, think about how to make yourself feel better. Help: Take an action to help yourself based on what you came up with in the "Think" step

Pastor's Corner


Religious Education is Fast Approaching!
