STAINED-GLASS REPAIR WORK

The project to repair our stained-glass windows is in progress. The technicians are repairing cracks, strengthening the base and siding of each window, and will replace the outside plexiglass protection on the windows, to let in more light. Expect to see parts of the church cordoned off and some entrances, particularly the back west entrance, closed during this period. We are grateful to the Catholic Foundation for Eastern Oklahoma that provided the major fund, and donors from our parish who stepped in with their invaluable support.



FAITH ENRICHMENT/PARISH MISSION



PARISH MISSION THESE COMING WEEKS



For three consecutive Thursdays: October 19th, 26th, and November 2nd, 6.30 pm to 8.30 pm, Karlo Broussard, apologist and speaker with *Catholic Answers*, is presenting a three-part series on the Eucharist entitled, *Face to Face with Jesus: The Catholic Doctrine of the Eucharist*. In this series of talks, Karlo provides the definitive answer to all those who doubt Christ's real presence in the Eucharist. He breaks down the common objections to the Catholic doctrine and builds a powerful case—from Scripture and the teaching and practices of the early Christians as well as the evidence for Eucharistic miracles—for taking Jesus at his word when he said: "I am the living bread which came down from heaven; if any one eats of this bread, he will live forever; and the bread which I shall give for the life of the world is my flesh" (John 6:51). The first meeting last Thursday was well attended. The next two meetings will hold in the parish hall. The meeting on November 2 (All Souls Day) will start at 7.00pm instead of 6.30pm to allow everyone to attend the All Souls Mass.
