

Good Friday

This is the celebration of the Lord's passion. To celebrate is to express a common meaning which binds a community together. Celebration need not mean extravagant partying. Today it is the deadly serious proclamation of Christians who hold above their heads the trophy of a victory bought at the price of one man's blood. This cross is his and our path to glory. That cross, in the vision of John's gospel, is a sign of glory.



THE GREAT EASTER VIGIL

Holy Saturday



Holy Saturday is the queen of all liturgies. The Church outdoes itself tonight. This is what it's all about. This is what we celebrate in one way or another all year long. We light the new fire, proclaiming Jesus to be our light and our life. We hear the readings that tell the primal stories

of who God is and who we are. Even before that, we hear the Exsultet, proclaiming the night of nights when Jesus rose. We bless the waters of baptism through which new members are initiated into the Church. Along with these new members, we celebrate the renewal of old members, insuring a Church alive and ever-new. Finally, the Eucharist celebrates our coming together to nourish ourselves at the font of all life—the Lord's table.

you take away the sins of the world, receive our prayer; you are seated at the right hand of the Father, have mercy on us.




