Blessed Epiphany chalk was used to protect homes against illnesses

The chalk is blessed by the priest and uses a prayer that asks God for good health and safety in the New Year.

Each year on the feast of Epiphany, chalk is blessed by priests around the world and then distributed to the parish. Parishioners are instructed to mark their doorposts in an action clearly inspired by the book of Exodus.

The Lord said to Moses and Aaron in the land of Egypt ... "take some of the blood [of the lamb], and put it on the two doorposts and the lintel of the houses in which they eat them. They shall eat the flesh that night, roasted; with unleavened bread and bitter herbs they shall eat it ... The blood shall be a sign for you, upon the houses where you are; and when I see the blood, I will pass over you, and no plague shall fall upon you to destroy you, when I smite the land of Egypt." (cf. Exodus 12:1-13)

It is an ancient tradition that calls upon God's blessing and protection.

Traditionally a priest blesses chalk on the Feast of the Epiphany by saying the following prayer (from the *Roman Ritual*):

Bless, + O Lord God, this creature, chalk, and let it be a help to mankind. Grant that those who will **use it with faith** in your most holy name, and with it inscribe on the doors of their homes the names of your saints, Casper, Melchior, and Baltassar, **may through their merits and intercession enjoy health in body and protection of soul;** through Christ our Lord.

Many families would take this seriously and **prayed the blessing with faith**, trusting that God would spare them diseases, plagues and other illnesses.

This is reflected in the prayer typically said by the head of the household when marking the doors with chalk.

Bless, + O Lord God almighty, this home, that in it there may be health, purity, the strength of victory, humility, goodness and mercy, the fulfillment of Thy law, the



The Epiphany of the Lord

Is 60:1-6 | Eph 3:2-3a, 5-6 | Mt 2:1-12

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

It's interesting how an event can be interpreted by different people. God's revelation of himself in the birth of the child Jesus is clearly one such event. The Magi, Gentiles from the east, had heard of this "newborn king of the Jews" and undertook a long and arduous journey to see him and offer him homage. They were edified and eager in their search. Herod, himself a king - of the Jews - did not have the same reaction. The very thought of this "newborn king" threatened him and filled him with rage and suspicion. In this moment in human history, the manifestation of Christ to the Gentiles (i.e., the Epiphany) unveils the truth of God's redemptive work for all of creation to be reconciled to himself. This truth has been accepted and rejected throughout time, and our celebration of this feast gives us an opportunity to give thanks in a focused and particular way for our acceptance of it - to give thanks for the gift of our faith. Perhaps it is even a moment for us to have our own, colloquial epiphany: an "aha moment," where we once again truly understand the depth of God's love for us.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

The Magi, the Gentiles from the east, were changed after their encounter with the Christ Child; they were warned not to return to Herod and they obeyed and took a different route home. In today's second reading, St. Paul says it has been revealed that Gentiles are "coheirs, members of the same body" - the body of Christ. Just as the magi were forever changed by their journey, so must we be. Their journey is a model for us, but we do not have to seek Christ in the world as they did; he is here with us, in Word and in the Eucharist. The Incarnation of Jesus is pure gift to our weary, troubled world. As we heard in Isaiah, "rise up! ... [our] light has come, the glory of the Lord shines upon [us]." As the Magi followed the light of the star, let us rise to the occasion and respond to God's light in our world by recognizing the good gifts God gives us each day. And then thank him for his enduring presence in our lives.

PRAY Lord God of heaven and earth, you revealed your only-begotten Son to every nation by the guidance of a star ... Fill us with the light of Christ, that our concern for others may reflect your love. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen (from USCCB Epiphany prayer for blessing of home)

Parish Finances

Included here is the cash basis financial summary for Blessed Trinity for the first quarter of fiscal 2024, the three months ended 09/31/2023, which reflects a net deficit of \$82,533.

In this report, Operating Revenue - Other, includes items such as Building Fund donations, donations for masses, donations for flowers and interest income. Pastoral Leadership expense includes all clergy wages, stipends and benefits as well as expenses of the rectory. Worship and Music expense includes wages and stipends for music and worship, as well as worship supplies and material, flowers and environment and music supplies and services. Administration includes employee benefits, administration wages, office expense, professional services, dues and subscriptions, telephone and technology expense. Facilities Maintenance includes building and grounds repairs and maintenance, maintenance wages, utilities and property and liability insurance.




Social Group


