

# Young people need to encounter Jesus and not simply know him

Many young people were taught about Jesus from their birth, but that knowledge needs to lead to an encounter that will help their faith endure.

Often it is the case that some older Catholics will lament about how many young people lose the faith after they graduate from high school. Many of these children were taught the Catholic faith from infancy and even attended Catholic schools.

Yet, all that knowledge about Jesus and the Church did not sustain their faith as they navigated the many storms of life.

What was missing in their lives? What could bring them closer to Christ?

#### An encounter with Jesus

St. John Paul II dealt head-on with this topic in a letter to the youth of Rome in 1997:

You have certainly heard of [Jesus] since you were small. But let me ask you a question: **Have you really met him?** In faith have you had **a living experience of him** as a loyal and faithful friend, or does his image still seem too far removed from your real problems to excite any interest?

It's possible to attend Catholic school throughout your entire life and never to have "met" Jesus in an intimate way.

What this means is changing our view of Jesus as a historical figure, but someone who is living and by our



side, as St. John Paul II explains:

Jesus is not only a great figure of the past, a teacher of life and morals. He is the risen Lord, the God who is close to every person, to whom we can speak and with whom we can experience the joy of friendship, hope in time of trouble and the certainty of a better future.

Young people are often not presented with this simple reality that God is not "in the clouds," but next to them. He is standing at the door, knocking at their hearts.

Jesus is someone who wants to be involved in every person's life. He wants to be with us in our joys and sorrows and most of all, to love us.

What young people need to do is to open up to that love, as St. John Paul II proclaims:

Dear young people, who does not want to love and to be loved? But to experience sincere love, you must open the door of your heart to Jesus and take the way he marked out with his own life: the way of selfgiving. This is the secret to the success of any real call to love, particularly of that call born in a surprising way in an adolescent's heart which leads to marriage, the priesthood or the consecrated life.

If we want young people to keep the faith when they are older, they need to "meet" Jesus on the road of their lives.

Knowledge is good, but it needs to lead to something deeper, an encounter with the Risen Lord.

# Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Wis 18:6-9 | Heb 11:1-2, 8-19 | Lk 12:32-48

#### GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

If we're honest with ourselves, we often want God to give us exactly what we ask for in prayer, or to provide immediate comfort in moments of need. But from the beginning, God revealed that the life of faith would entail trusting in his promises even as we wait for their final fulfilment. The example of Abraham in the second reading can be our model. We are called to emulate Abraham's obedient trust: "for he thought that the one who had made the promise was trustworthy." Throughout the Scriptures God promised his people that he would prepare a place for them. This promise propelled the Israelites through famine, exile, and agony, until God brought them to their earthly homeland. Jesus promises a new and everlasting place of rest, where we will live with God forever. We wait in joyful hope that one day he himself will bring us to our heavenly home. Amid the difficulties of life, in seasons of grief, pain, or confusion, it is easy to let doubt creep in. This is when, more than ever, we must cling to our faith, which Paul describes as "the realization of what is hoped for and evidence of things not seen."

#### GO EVANGELIZE

#### PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

Trusting in God, we are called to wait with hope and prepare ourselves to readily receive him when he comes. Today's Gospel from Luke provides an image for us to imitate: the faithful servant dutifully awaiting his master's return. What does Jesus say about these servants who keep close watch, always prepared for the moment their master will return? "Blessed are those servants whom the master finds vigilant on his arrival." The faithful witness of the servants in the Gospel reminds us not to overcomplicate our faith. We simply need to remain diligent in carrying out the work that God has given us to do here and now and to keep ourselves alert as we wait with patience for the coming of the Lord.

#### PRAY

Our faith strengthens us as we wait for the Lord — as we hold on to the radical belief that our destination is heaven, and our God keeps his promises. Wherever you find yourself on the journey today, cling to his promises! Ask for the grace for deeper trust in him and for greater faithfulness to the work of building up his kingdom as you wait for God to bring all things to their ultimate fulfillment.






