# St. Faustina's experience receiving the invisible stigmata

A lesser known story from the life of St. Faustina is that she received the invisible stigmata, feeling the pain Jesus suffered on the cross.

At times God allows certain saints to receive what is know as the *stigmata*, the miraculous presence of Jesus' wounds reproduced in the body.

The wounds usually appear visibly on the head (as Jesus' head was wounded by the crown of thorns), on the hands and feet (as Jesus was wounded with the nails), and on the side (as Jesus was wounded with the lance).

But some saints have borne the stigmata invisibly, with the wounds causing pain but not being visible to the outside world.

St. Faustina falls into this last category, as she did not have any external wounds, but only invisible wounds that produced an intense amount of pain.

#### Invisible stigmata

St. Faustina explains her experience in her *Diary*:

When I experienced these sufferings for the first time, it was like this: after the annual vows, on a certain day, during prayer, I saw a great brilliance and, issuing from the brilliance, rays which completely enveloped me. Then suddenly, I felt a terrible pain in my hands, my feet and my side and the thorns of the crown of thorns. I experienced these sufferings during holy Mass on Friday, but this was only for a brief moment. This was repeated for several Fridays. (*Diary*, 759)

For St. Faustina, this was an occasional pain, one that only lasted for a short amount of time. Some saints experienced the pain more frequently, while others simply had the external sign, with little pain.

God does not grant such a grace for no particular reason, but typically to invite an individual into his pain and suffering, and to help that saint offer the pain for others.

St. Faustina saw the pain as a way that she could offer suffering for the conversion of souls:

During holy Mass one Friday, I felt myself pierced by the same sufferings, and this has been repeated on every Friday and sometimes **when I meet a soul that is not in the state of grace**. Although this is infrequent, and the suffering lasts a very short time, still it is terrible, and I would not be able to bear it without a special grace from God. There is no outward indication of these sufferings. What will come later, I do not know. **All this, for the sake of souls**. (*Diary*, 759)

St. Faustina received many special graces in her life, graces that she didn't ask for, but that were granted to her because of her receptivity and openness to God's will.





# Twenty-eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time

2 Kgs 5:14-17 | 2 Tim 2:8-13 | Lk 17:11-19

#### GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

After his healing in the Jordan river, Naaman returns to Elisha. It's clear from their ensuing conversation that his miraculous healing had led to him recognizing the God of Israel as the one who had healed him. In thanksgiving, he desires to offer sacrifice, and pledges that he "will no longer offer holocaust or sacrifice to any other god except the Lord." In the Gospel, we see the Samaritan returning to Jesus after his healing, falling at the Lord's feet and "glorifying God in a loud voice." It's clear from both Scriptures that when we recognize what God has done for us, our first response is to worship. That's why our central act of worship as a Christian community is called Eucharist - from the Greek word for thanksgiving. When we come to worship God, what is it that we're grateful for? If gratitude is the heart of worship, it's a fruitful practice to intentionally spend some time considering God's providence in our lives over the past week so we come to the liturgy prepared to offer thanks.

#### **GO EVANGELIZE**

#### PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

Something that has always struck me about today's Gospel is that Jesus heals all ten of the lepers, not only the one who returned to offer thanks. While we, as humans, can be tempted to withhold love when we know it will not be acknowledged or appreciated, Jesus heals all ten. God is good to us, even when we're ungrateful. As Paul says, "If we are unfaithful he remains faithful, for he cannot deny himself." God can do only one thing: love. How powerful would it be if we worked to imitate the kind of gratuitous love we see in today's Gospel? Think about opportunities to practice this kind of love. What a witness this would be to the world if we were to imitate God's way of loving. As the Persian poet Hafiz wrote: "Even after all this time, the sun never says to the earth, 'You owe me.' Look what happens with a love like that. It lights the whole sky."

#### REFLECT

Take some time before Mass each Sunday to do an examine-style prayer, reflecting on where you've seen God's action in your life during the week. How has God provided for your needs? How has God accompanied you through challenges? How has the Spirit of God brought consolation and strength? Make a list of all the places you've experienced God's presence and grace and prepare to offer thanks to God for these gifts at Mass.






