Ash Wednesday reminds us to focus on inner change during Lent

Lent is a season in the Church devoted almost entirely to a Christian "rebirth," where we examine our lives and discern where we have drifted away from God.

While the month of January in secular culture is typically devoted to New Year's resolutions and implementing various changes in our lives, the Church provides the season of Lent for similar purposes.

Lent is a time when we need to examine our lives and question how close we are to God.

Spiritual renewal is at the heart of the season of Lent, and the Church encourages us to fully embrace it.

For example, on Ash Wednesday one option for the priest or minister to use when imposing ashes are the words, "**Repent and believe in the Gospel.**" This helps cement even more the idea that we need to turn around our lives toward God.

Born again

Pope Benedict XVI elaborated on this spiritual aspect of Lent in a general audience in 2007 on Ash Wednesday. He specifically connected it to those preparing for Baptism and how each one of us needs to prepare to be "reborn" in a spiritual way:

Lent is a **renewed "catechumenate" for us too**, in which once again we approach our Baptism to rediscover and relive it in depth, to return to being truly Christian. Lent is thus an opportunity to "**become**" **Christian "anew"**, through a constant process of **inner change** and progress in the knowledge and love of Christ. Conversion is never once and for all but is a process, an interior journey through the whole of life.

In many ways this is why the Church encourages **Lenten sacrifices**, in hopes that the things we give up will lead us to open our hearts wide to God's grace.

This is one of the reasons why giving up chocolate may be one good thing to do during Lent, it shouldn't be our only sacrifice.

We need to look intentionally at our spiritual life to discern where we need to grow.

Instead of giving something up, we may decide to pray more on a daily basis, sacrificing our time to the Lord.


Above all, Lent is about **conversion of heart**, which Pope Benedict XVI explains:

To be converted thus means not pursuing one's own personal success - that is something ephemeral - but giving up all human security, **treading in the Lord's footsteps with simplicity and trust so that Jesus may become for each one, as Blessed Teresa of Calcutta liked to say, "my All in all"**.

Whether we realize it or not, we are all in need of conversion and Lent is the perfect time to renew our efforts to let God truly reach the depths of our hearts.

It is a time to let ourselves be "born again" in our spiritual lives.



GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

In today's Gospel, Jesus tells his disciples that "unless your righteousness surpasses that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will not enter the kingdom of heaven." In Matthew 23:3-5, Jesus says, "Do and observe all things whatsoever [the scribes and Pharisees] tell you, but do not follow their example. For they preach but they do not practice ... All their works are performed to be seen." What Jesus is inviting us to see is that to authentically live the commandments requires more than mere external compliance with the letter of the law. It's also not about putting on a show so that others think we're "holy." Rather, it's about the quiet, inner transformation of our hearts. The Gospel tells us it's not enough that we avoid murder; God wants to free us from anger and wrath. It's not enough to avoid unfaithfulness in marriage; God wants to give us hearts that are pure and free from lust. Our task is to open our hearts to the transforming power of his commandments which, if we live them, lead us to fullness of life.

PRAY

Accepting the Lord's teaching in the commandments requires humility, and understanding their true meaning and depth is the result of the Spirit's work in our lives. Ask the Holy Spirit to give you true insight to live the commandments with your whole heart. Consider using these lines from today's psalm in your prayer: "Open my eyes, that I may consider the wonders of your law. Instruct me, O Lord, in the way of your statutes, that I may exactly observe them. Give me discernment, that I may observe your law and keep it with all my heart."

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

In our second reading, St. Paul speaks about some challenges we face when sharing the faith with others. There are those who are unable to grasp God's wisdom, which is different from the wisdom of this age. God's wisdom is mysterious, hidden, and can only be understood and grasped through a revelation of the Spirit. This is an important concept for us as evangelizers. Sometimes no matter how hard we try, no matter how eloquent we are at explaining something, those who are not ready to receive what we have to share will not be able to receive it. In order for others to understand the Gospel, the Spirit must open their hearts to receive it. While we are responsible to share the Gospel as well as we're able, it is up to the person before us to respond to God's invitation.





I ask that you please make the following announcement at all Masses during this coming weekend (February 14-15, 2026) or include it in the same weekend's parish bulletin, if possible. It is likely that this notification may raise some questions among the faithful and perhaps the media. Such questions should be referred to the Office of Communications and Information of the Diocese of St. Petersburg: (727) 344-1611. Thank you for your attention to this matter.

Announcement from the Diocese: *An accusation of inappropriate physical contact with a minor has been made against Reverend William Lau, a retired priest of the Diocese of Saint Petersburg, who formerly served as Parochial Vicar of Blessed Trinity from February 1987 to June 1996.*

The activity allegedly took place while Father Lau was serving at Christ the King Parish, Tampa, from June 1980 to September 1982. The Diocese has notified the State Attorney's office of the allegation.

Victims of abuse are encouraged to report crimes to local law enforcement. They may also wish to contact Mr. John Lambert, LCSW, diocesan Victim Assistance Coordinator at (866) 407-4505.
