



"My dear brothers and sisters in Christ, being a Catholic Christian is not easy. While the world turns its eyes and even its hearts from the cross, we are called today in the Gospel to take up our cross and follow Jesus. With the current Pandemic in the world, we see and hear many people coming to help those who are suffering. At the same time, there are those who see this as an opportunity to do harm - riots, looting and gouging the price of the necessities of survival, etc. Would this be the world we want to have? Are we one disaster away from being like those who prey on the sufferings of others? What kind of suffering will it take to influence us to turn our hearts away from the sufferings of others? In other words, what will it take for us to lose our humanity? As Catholic Christians, I hope it will never come to this. We are God's children in our baptism and are charged with the mission to bring the Good

News of salvation to the world in our actions and prayers. In Jesus Christ, we are the instruments of hope in the world. But what about the sufferings around us? There are brothers and sisters in our community and perhaps in our family that are suffering. Have we responded charitably towards them? These are hard but real questions we must ask ourselves. Are we just takers, always expecting others to cater to our every whim? Or are we givers? For, it is in giving that we receive.

The Church of the Nativity, for all of us, is our Church and the cornerstone of our faith where we build our family and community. What happens to her reflects us and our faith. We do have a great and faith filled community. The question for you and me is how have we been building up this community? We have strength in numbers, and you can take part in building up our community and church here, to be a light and godly example for others to see God's love and work in this little vineyard of His. It is all about prioritizing what is important in our lives. If the things of God are not at the top of our priority list, then we need to change so that they can be. We cannot expect God to bless us if we do not take care of our faith, which means words and deeds, which translate to the corporal and spiritual works of mercy. As you will recall, the corporal works of mercy are helping others with material and physical needs such as feeding the hungry, sheltering the homeless, clothing the naked, visiting the sick and imprisoned, burying the dead by attending funeral masses for those of our community, and giving alms to the poor. The spiritual works of mercy are the acts of compassion which involve teaching the faith, advising those needing the wisdom of our experience, consoling those suffering, comforting one another in times of need, forgiving one another, and especially, bearing wrongs patiently.

In our suffering, will we complain like Jeremiah or will we try to avoid it like Peter in the Gospel today? This is not to point to their downfall, but to weak moments in their lives as well as ours. We must and can bear our cross patiently. As St. Paul reminds us in his letters to the Romans, "Do not conform yourselves to this age but be transformed by the renewal of your mind that you may discern what is the will of God, that which is good and pleasing and perfect." God does not cause sufferings, but sometimes he allows them to bring about good. Sufferings can bring the best or the worst out in people. We cannot be naïve in thinking that we will never turn our eyes and hearts away from the sufferings of others. If we stay near the light of Christ in the church, we will see things other cannot see. To do this we must put aside our selfish desires and take up our cross each day to help build up the kingdom of God, beginning with our family and community. Jesus reminds us in the Gospel, "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me."

When God calls us home, "he will repay all according to his conduct." The world always reduces the cross to novelties, jewelry, and the like. The cross is a stumbling block to those who have yet to know Jesus. We all have inner struggles, like Jeremiah, in being faithful to God's call to serve as his prophet in the world. In our ministry, we will face challenges, but "We can do all things through Christ who strengthens us." Everybody has a cross. The question is: what we are going to do with that cross? Will we deny it, rebel against it, curse it, numb ourselves with alcohol and drugs to make us forget it? Or will we take it up and follow Jesus? The Lord teaches us the great truth of the Christian faith, that the cross is our way to life everlasting with him.

Children's Faith Formation

The Church of the Nativity invites all children and youth, baptized or not, to participate in the catechetical program. Faith Formation is designed for children in grades K-8 who are not currently attending a Catholic school.

Goals

The goals of Nativity's Faith Formation are:

- Ongoing conversion to Jesus Christ
- Full participation in the life of the Catholic Church
- To foster community among the students, their families and the Parish community

Program Overview & Calendar

Faith Formation for the 2020-2021 school year will be a hybrid model. We will offer online classes through My Catholic Faith Delivered and monthly Faith Formation in-person classes. These classes will be activity based and intended to compliment the online learning. Because students have already done the reading and taken their test online, classes with the catechists can be hands-on, project based activities that are fun and engaging for the child - no textbooks or worksheets!

NOTE: We are still working out what our monthly in-person classes will look like. Given the recent mandate by Governor Newsom, we are working with the diocese to determine how we can best facilitate Faith Formation classes for the fall. Please stay tuned for more details.

First Communion and First Reconciliation

In union with the Diocese of San Diego, there is a <u>two year process</u> to prepare students for First Holy Communion, which begins in First Grade and completes in Second Grade. We also have an option for those who wish to begin their First Holy Communion journey post first/second grade.

Registration Payment Information

Tuition is \$130 for one child for the entire year. There is a 20% discount off tuition for each additional sibling. Tuition for children receiving First Communion is \$225, which covers additional materials and photography for the First Communion Mass.

Tuition helps cover the cost of books, supplies, activities, and related expenses. All materials needed for the classes are provided. Full payment is necessary for enrollment. However, no child will be turned away for financial reasons. Parents willing to volunteer in the classroom are eligible for discounted tuition. 

Our Youth Ministry year will begin on September 20, Catechetical Sunday, with a Parent and New Teen Orientation Meeting on Zoom from 5-6:15pm. Meeting details and log-in information will be emailed to all parents and teens the week of the meeting. This meeting is only for new teens to the Youth Ministry Program and their parents.

Our 2nd meeting on September 27 will be for all freshmenseniors together on Zoom. We will discuss the online learning model and set up our small groups for the first few months.

RCIA

R.C.I.A. will start online on September 20 via a Zoom session. Log in information will be emailed to all class members earlier in that week.

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (R.C.I.A.) is the process that welcomes you to join the Catholic faith community and introduces you to the beliefs and practices of the Church. If you are not baptized, the process leads to the reception of the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist. If you are Baptized in another Christian tradition, the process invites you to participate fully in the church through the Sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist.

If you are an adult looking to learn more about or to be initiated into the Catholic faith, need to prepare for a missed sacrament, or are a lifelong Catholic looking for a refresher course, then the R.C.I.A. can help.

During each R.C.I.A. session we spend time answering your questions about the Catholic faith, reviewing the Scripture readings from Mass, and discussing the current chapter in our book. The most important thing is getting your questions answered. The R.C.I.A. meets from September through Easter every year. If you are interested in joining, please contact Mike James, R.C.I.A.
